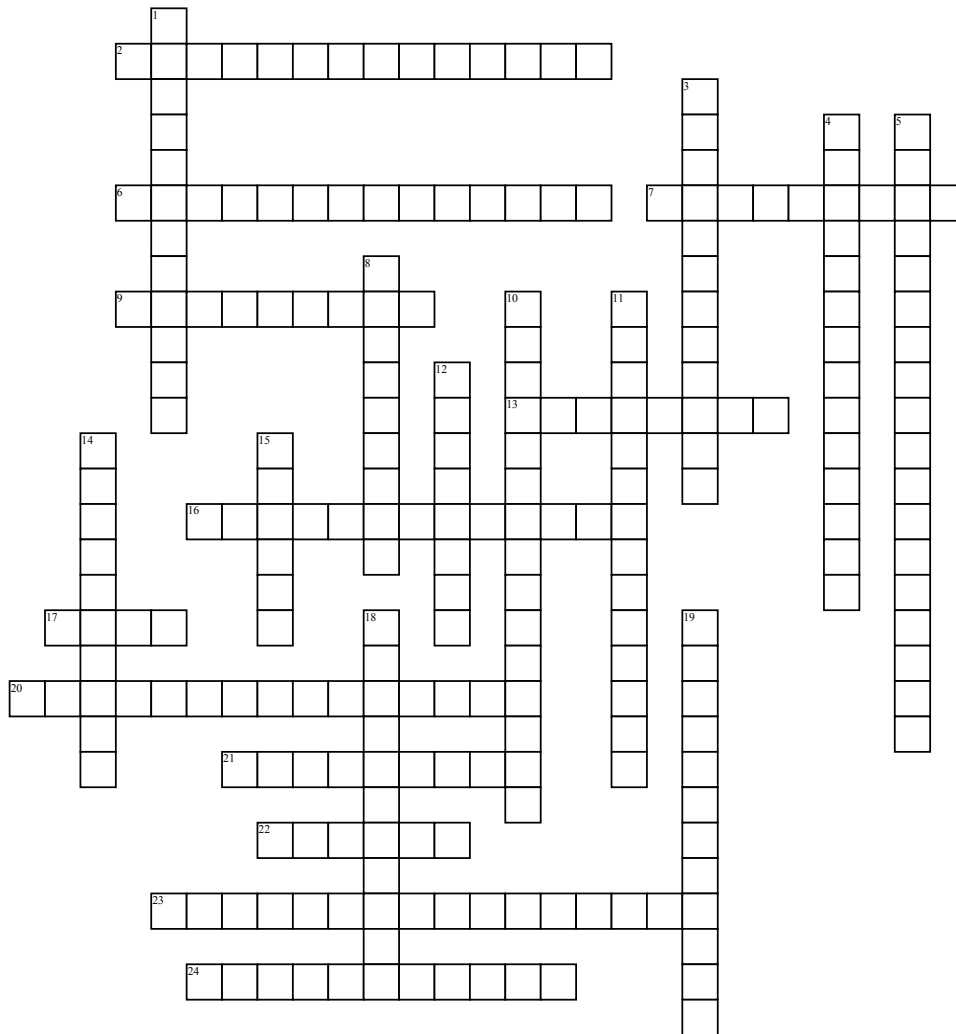


# 1.01 Chapter Definitions

- 2. is provided in a person's home
- 6. is care given by specialists
- 7. thin tubes inserted into the body to drain fluids or inject fluids
- 9. is 24-hour skilled care given in hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers for people who require short-term, immediate care for illnesses or injuries
- 13. is a medical assistance program for low-income people
- 16. is a term given to the process of transforming services for elders so that they are based on the values and practices of the person receiving care
- 17. means to find a problem through a survey
- 20. is an independent, not-for-profit organization that evaluates and accredits healthcare organizations

- 21. are people or organizations that provide health care, including doctors, nurses, clinics, and agencies
- 22. are people or organizations paying for healthcare services
- 23. are for people who need some assistance and supervision during certain hours, but who do not live in the facility where care is provided
- 24. is medically necessary care given by a skilled nurse or therapist; it is available 24 hours a day

**Down**

- 1. is given in long-term care facilities for people who need 24-hour skilled care
- 3. is care given in a hospital or in long-term care facility
- 4. is usually given for less than 24 hours
- 5. emphasizes the individuality of the person who needs care, and seeks to build community by recognizing and developing each person's capabilities

- 8. is a method, or way, of doing something.
- 10. the illness will eventually cause death
- 11. facilities are residences for people who need some help with daily care, such as showers, meals, and dressing
- 12. is a health insurance program that was established in 1965 for people aged 65 or older
- 14. are places where care is delivered or administered, including hospitals, long-term care facilities, and treatment centers
- 15. is a course of action that should be taken every time a certain situation occurs
- 18. is given in facilities or homes for people who have approximately six months of less to live
- 19. may be short, such as a few days or months, or longer than six months.
