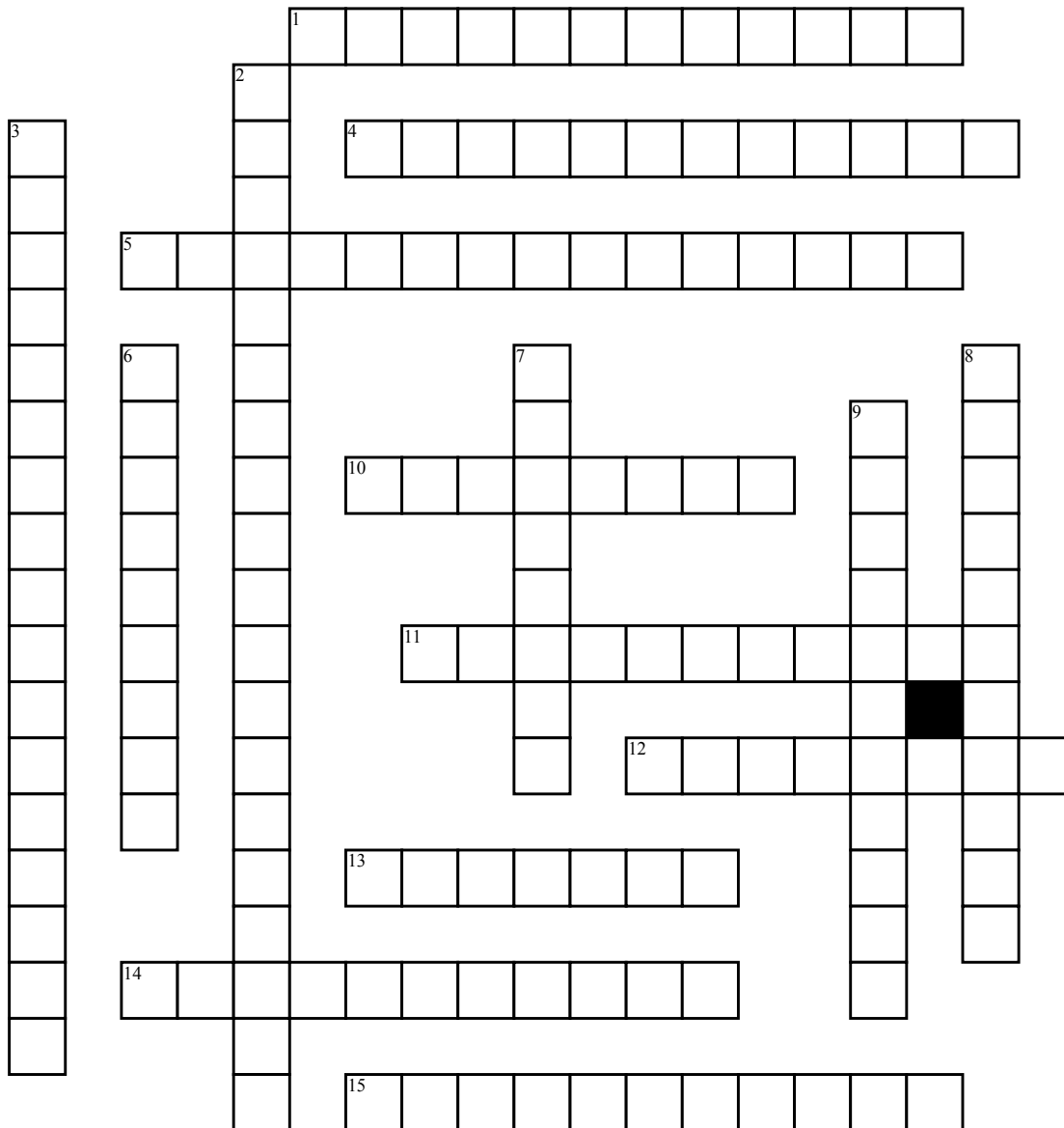


# 1920s and 1930s
