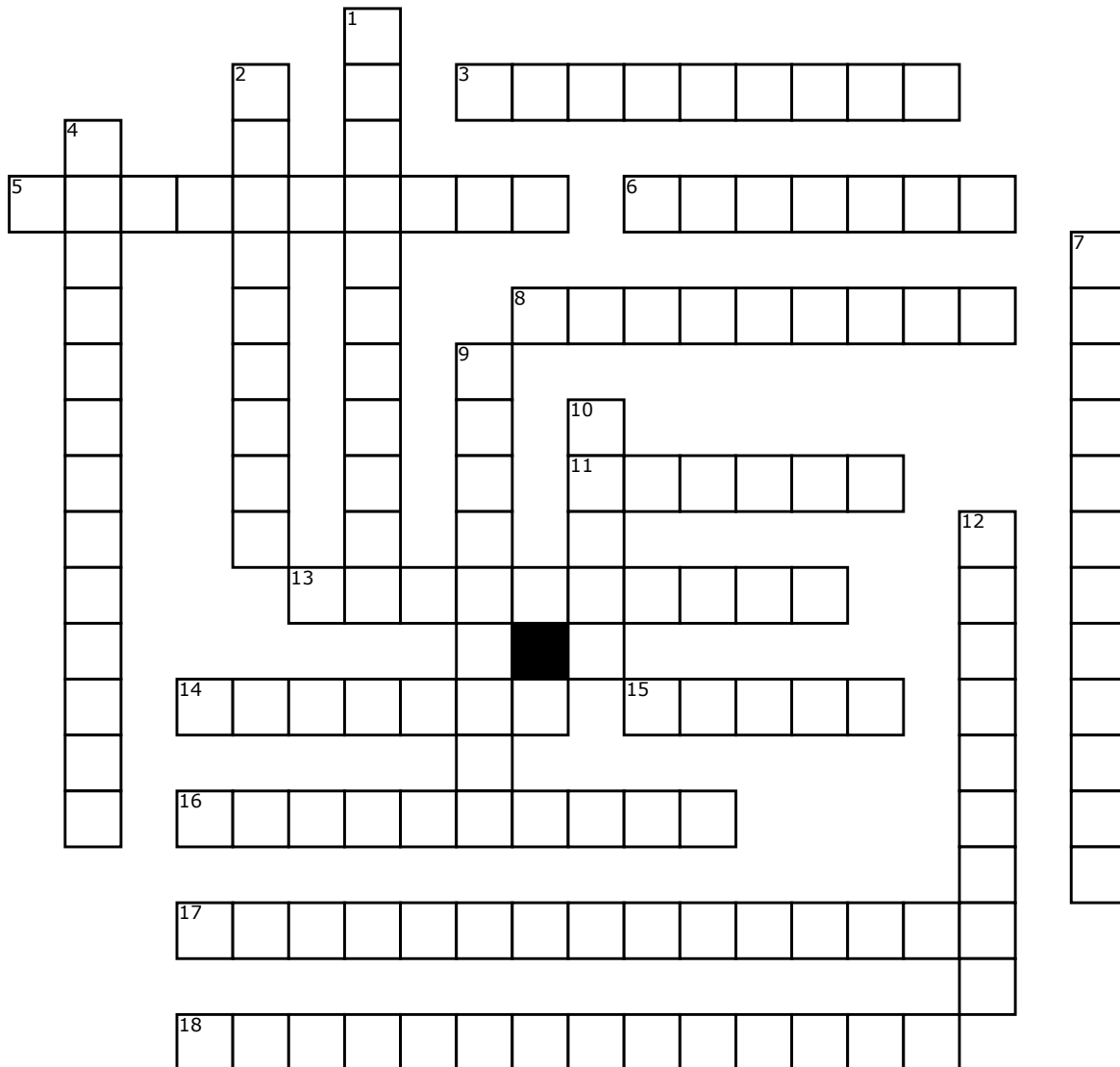


1920's crossword puzzle
