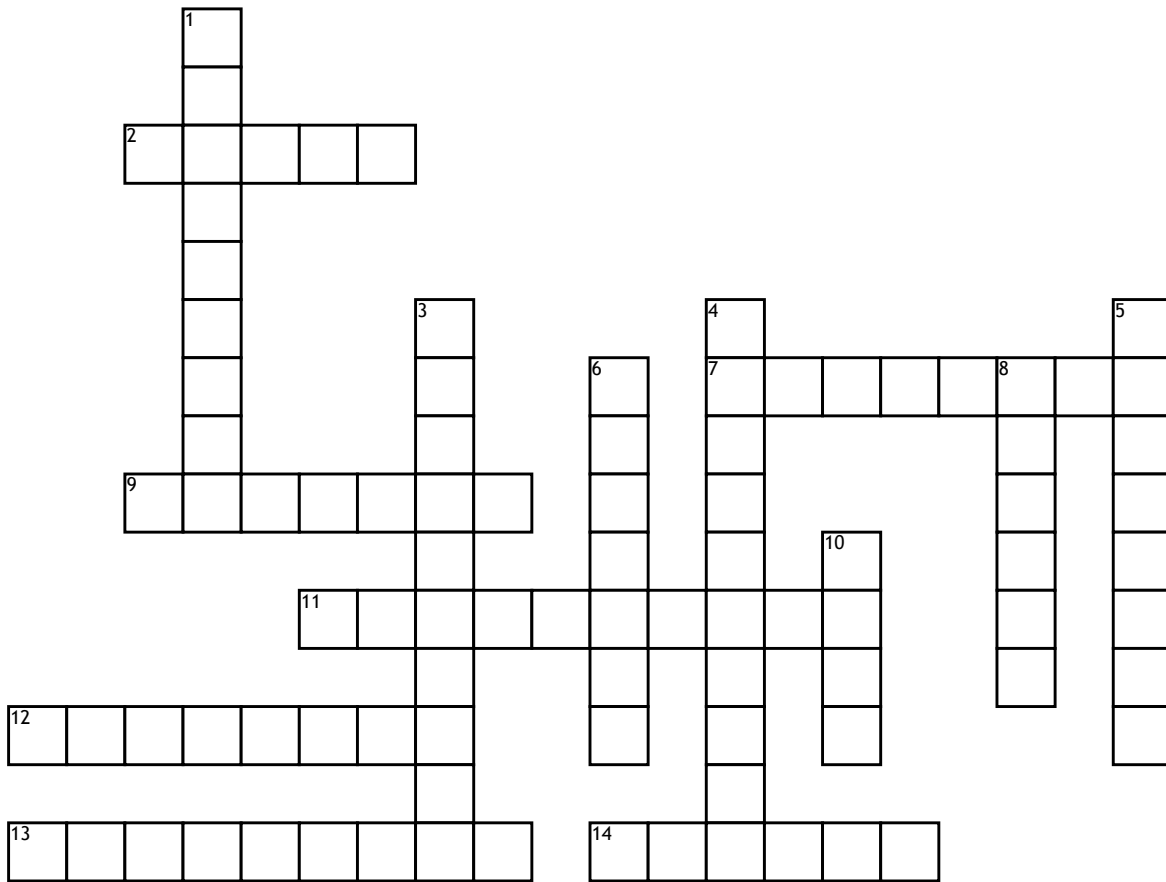

7. Japanese city devastated by the second atomic bomb, dropped August 9, 1945. Over 70,000 civilians were killed and another 70,000 injured.
9. a political system headed by a dictator that calls for extreme nationalism and racism and no tolerance of opposition
11. Information - including facts, rumors, opinions, or lies - that is used to convince people of a certain message

12. a plane loaded with explosives and piloted in a suicide attack
13. Greek word meaning "complete destruction by fire," used to describe the persecution and murder of millions of people under Nazi power in the 1930s and 1940s
14. Allow people a fixed amount of food or other items, such as gasoline or fabric, when there is a shortage

1. City in Japan that was devastated by the first atomic bomb, August 6, 1945: 80,000 civilians were killed and many more injured

3. Germany, Italy, and Japan, and their allies during World War Two
4. Being confined or held prisoner
5. Person not in the armed forces
6. A person who flees from a country for protection from invasion, oppression, or persecution
8. Countries fighting together in World War II, including the U.S., Great Britain, the Soviet Union
10. National Socialist German Workers Party, a right-wing, nationalistic, anti-Semitic political party founded in 1919, headed by Adolf Hitler from 1932-1945
