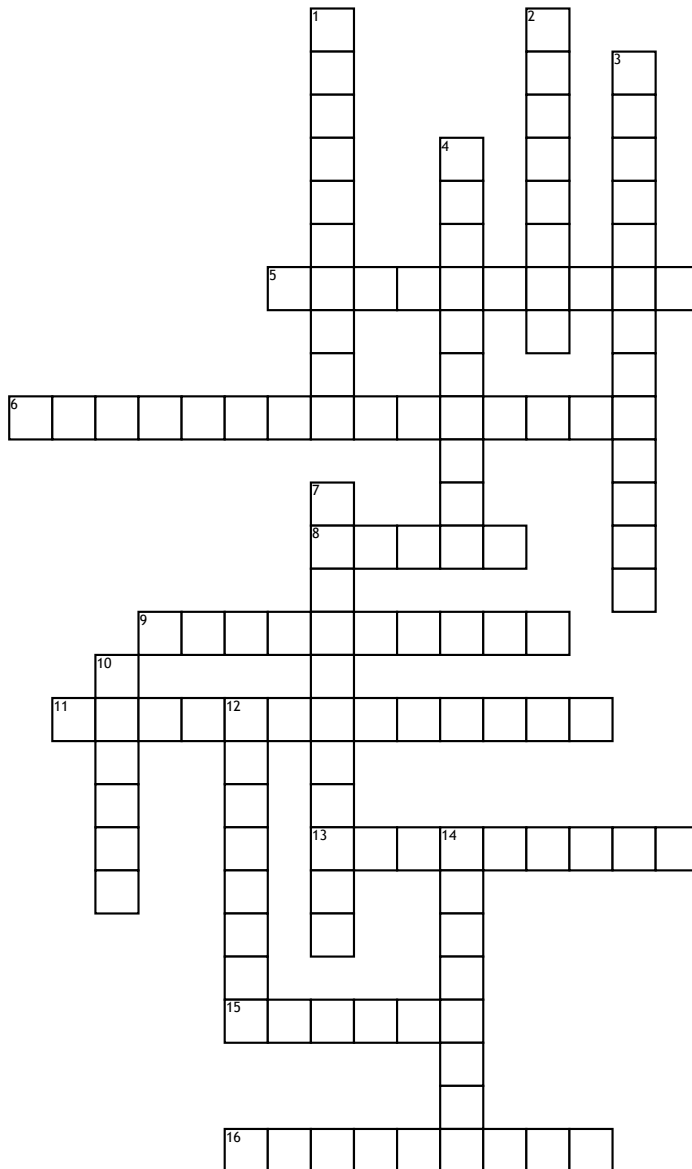


5 Stages of Grief and Stress
