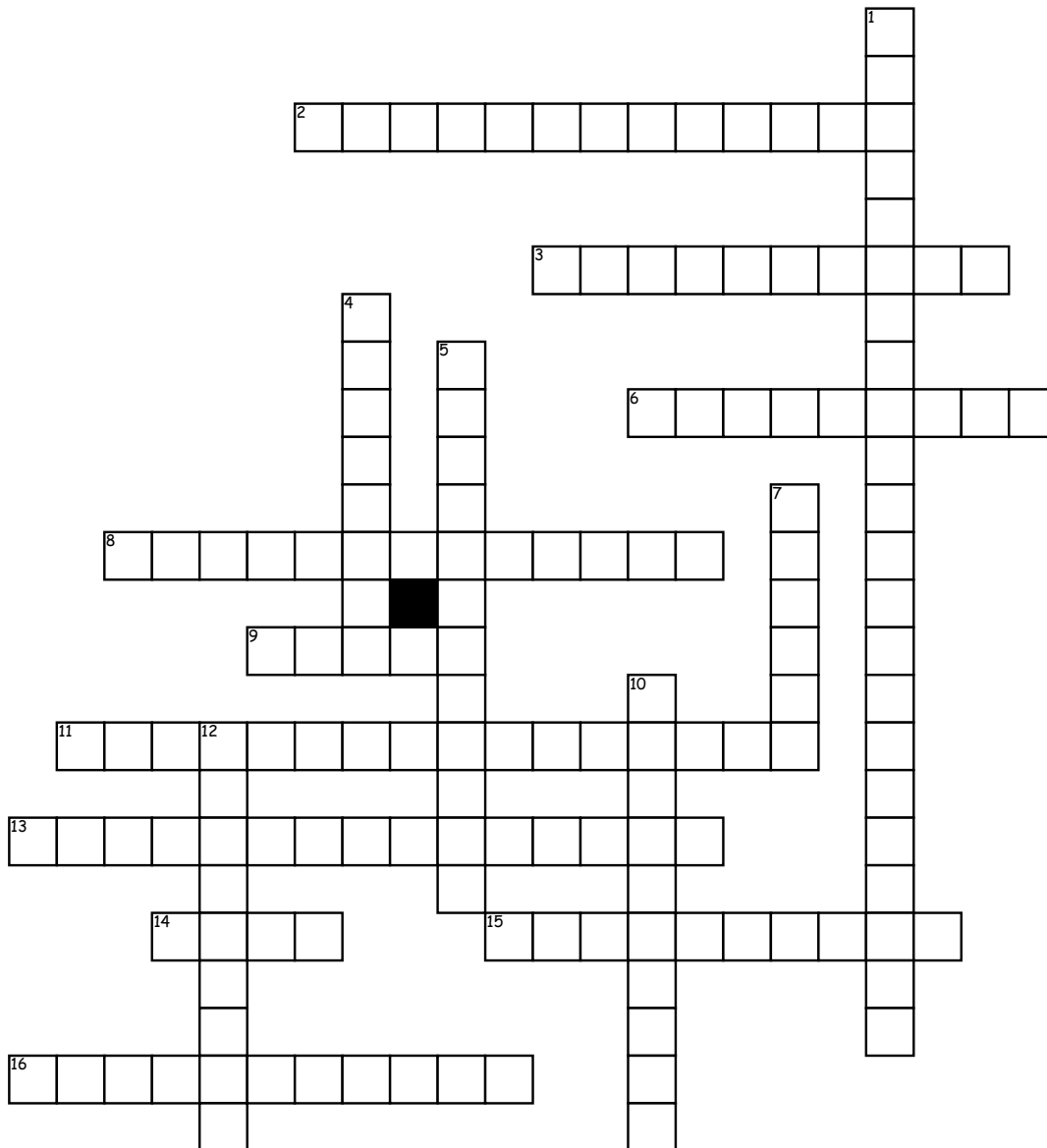

2. The process of socially organisation a conversation if two people find that they have been talking simultaneously
3. The rise and fall of a voice or the variation or tune to keep listeners interested.

8. A moment in turn taking where one utterance constrains the response in some way- e.g. question leads to an answer, suggestion leads to an acceptance or declination
9. The rise and fall of the voice- can be 'squeaky' or 'deep'
