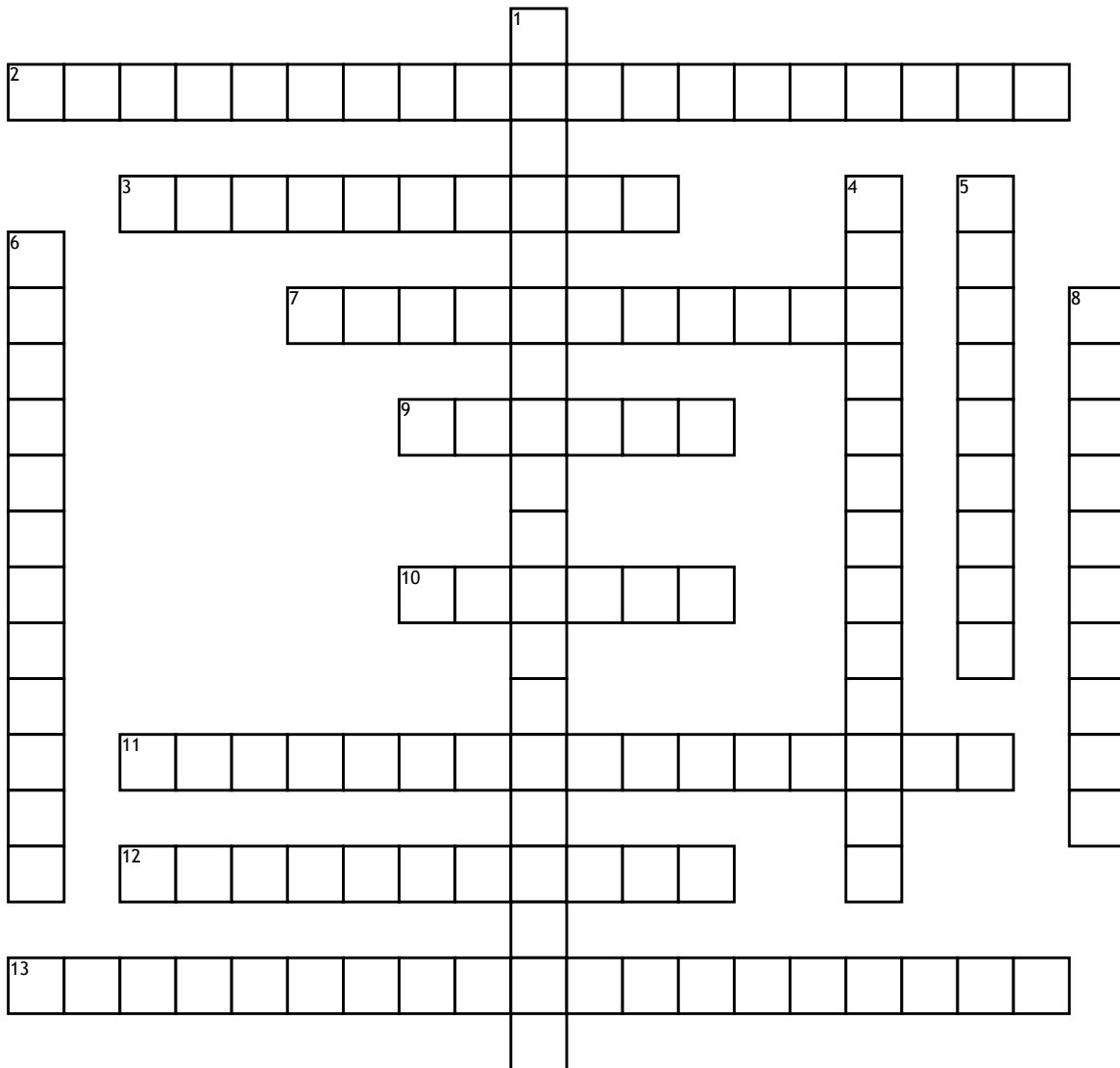

- 2. Demonstrates an inverse relationship; as one variable increases, the other variable decreases and visa versa
- 3. All the cases in a group being studied from which samples may be drawn
- 7. Repeating the essence of a research study, usually with different participants in different situations
- 9. An explanation using an integrated set of principle that organizes observations and predicts behaviors and events

- 10. A technique for ascertaining the self-reported attitudes or behaviors of a particular group
- 11. Thinking that does not blindly accept arguments and conclusions
- 12. A measure of the extent to which two factors vary together and thus of how well either factor predicts the other
- 13. The perception of a relationship where none exists

- 1. Direct relationship of two variables; as one increases, the other increases; as one decreases, the other decreases

- 4. Tendency to believe one could have foreseen an outcome
- 5. An observation technique in which one person is studied in depth in the hope of revealing universal principles
- 6. A sample that fairly represents a population because each member has an equal chance of inclusion
- 8. Testable prediction often implied by a theory
