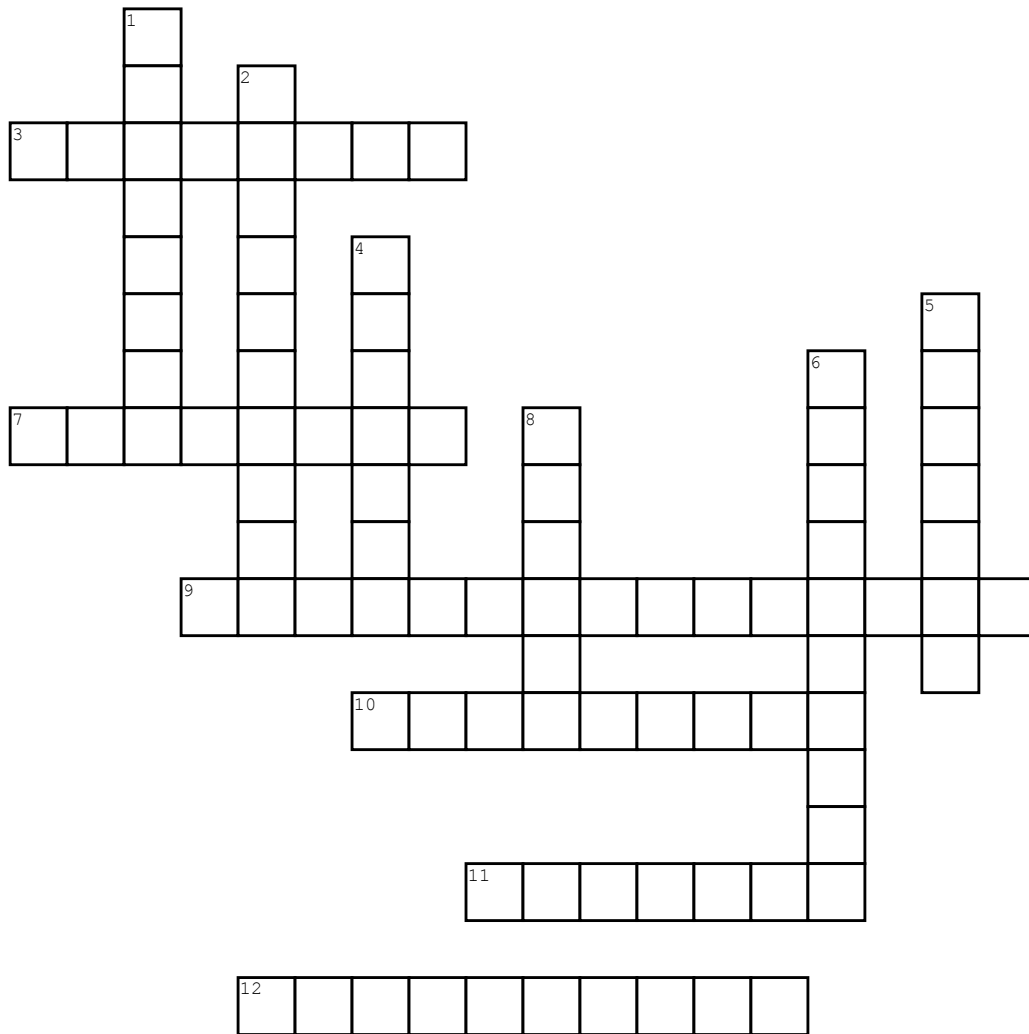

7. two words put together that are inherently contradictory

9. giving human qualities to non-human things (objects, animals, ideas, etc.)

10. exaggerated statements or claims not meant to be taken literally

11. employs an understatement by using double negatives or, in other words, positive statement expressed by negating opposite expressions

12. literary device in which a part represents a whole or vice versa, or larger groups represent smaller groups and vice versa. it may also call a thing by the name of its material or packaging

1. substitution of the name of an attribute or adjunct for that of the thing meant

2. when a character in a literary work speaks to an object, an idea, or someone who doesn't exist as if it's a living person; produces a dramatic effect and shows importance of object or idea; often uses "O"

4. witty understatement that belittles or dismisses something or somebody, particularly by making use of terms that gives impressions that something is less serious than it is or it should be

5. extended metaphor; statement that appears to be silly or self contradictory or silly but may include a latent truth

6. contrast of ideas expressed by parallelism

8. figure of speech that makes a direct comparison, showing similarities between two different things using "like" or "as"
