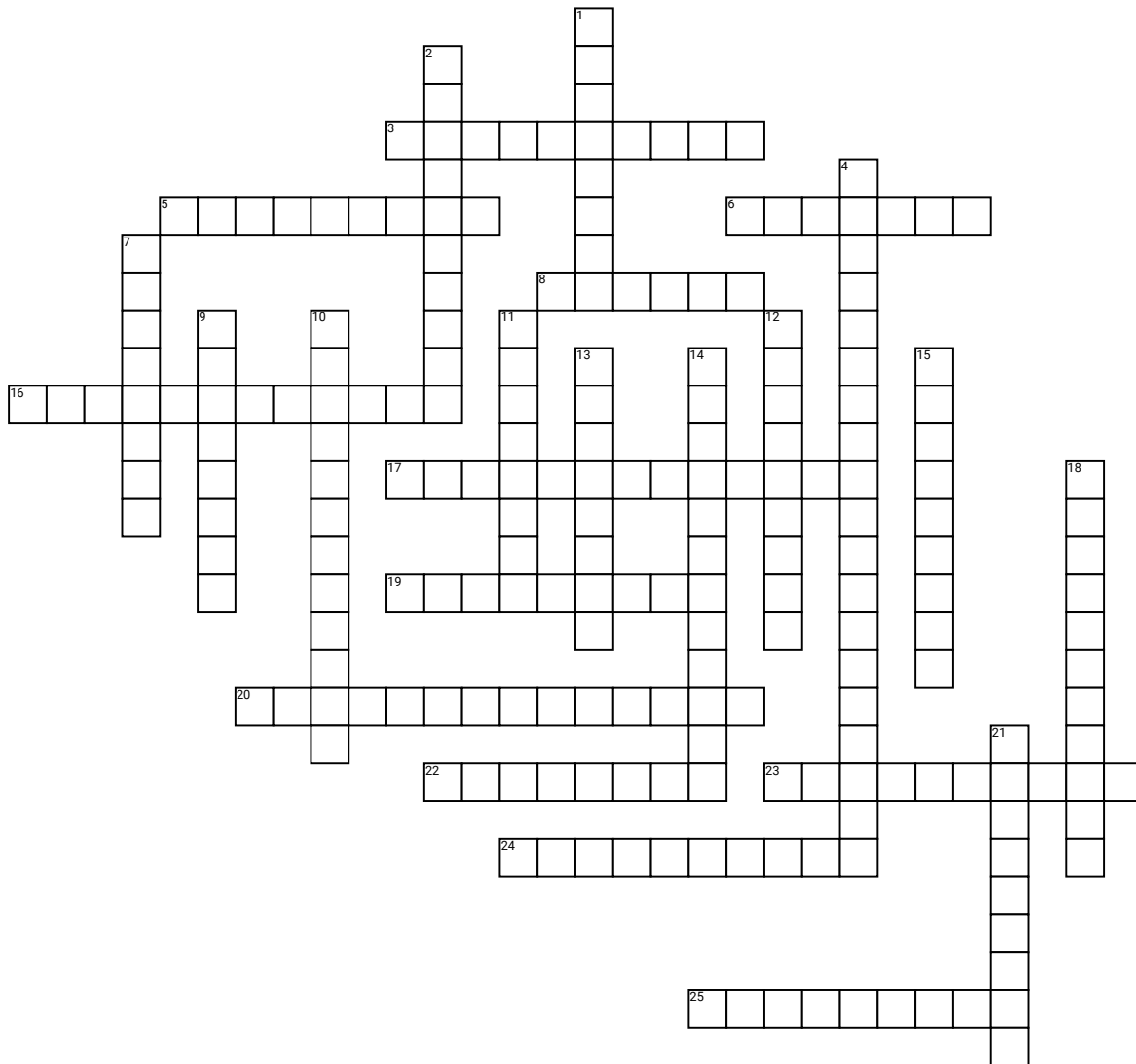


Africana Studies Crossword Puzzle
