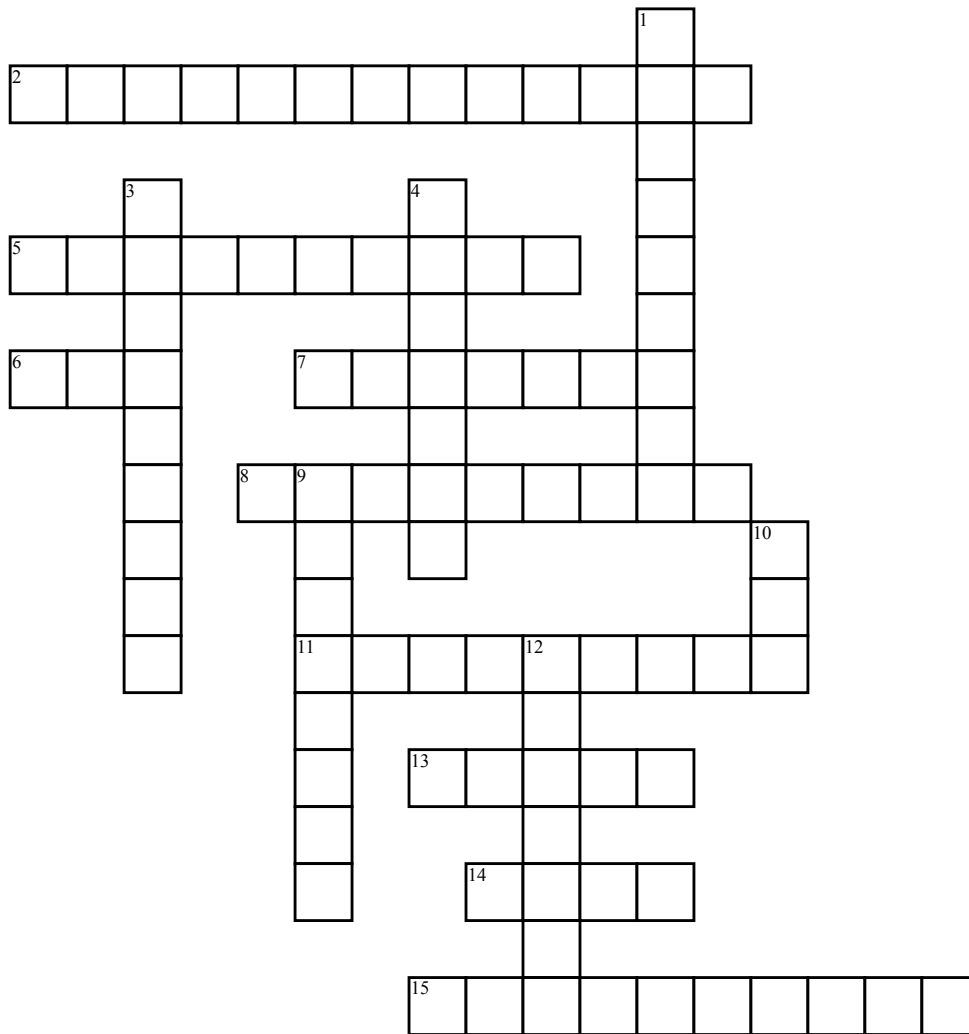


All About Acting!

2. A scene performed with little to no rehearsal.
 5. The nine acting areas of a stage.
 EX: center stage, downstage left, upstage right, etc. (two words)
 6. The actual pieces of furniture, platforms, or other items on the stage.
 7. The imaginary place and time the stage area represents.
 8. The imaginary person, thing, or animal the actor pretends to be on stage.
 11. A scene for two people. (two words)

13. The "real person" on the stage.
 14. Any item used on stage.
 15. Information given through dialogue during a scene that explains events leading up to the action.

Down

1. A scene for one actor, who speaks his or her thoughts aloud and talks to an imaginary character or directly to the audience.
 3. A performance that communicates an idea or an action without using dialogue.

4. A movement, usually of the arms, that helps to express an idea or a feeling.
 9. A prop that can be easily handled.
 EX: books, chalk, dishes, etc. (two words)
 10. A signal to begin action or dialogue.
 12. A large prop, such as a piece of furniture, that is not easily moved. EX: chairs, tables, fireplaces, etc. (two words)
