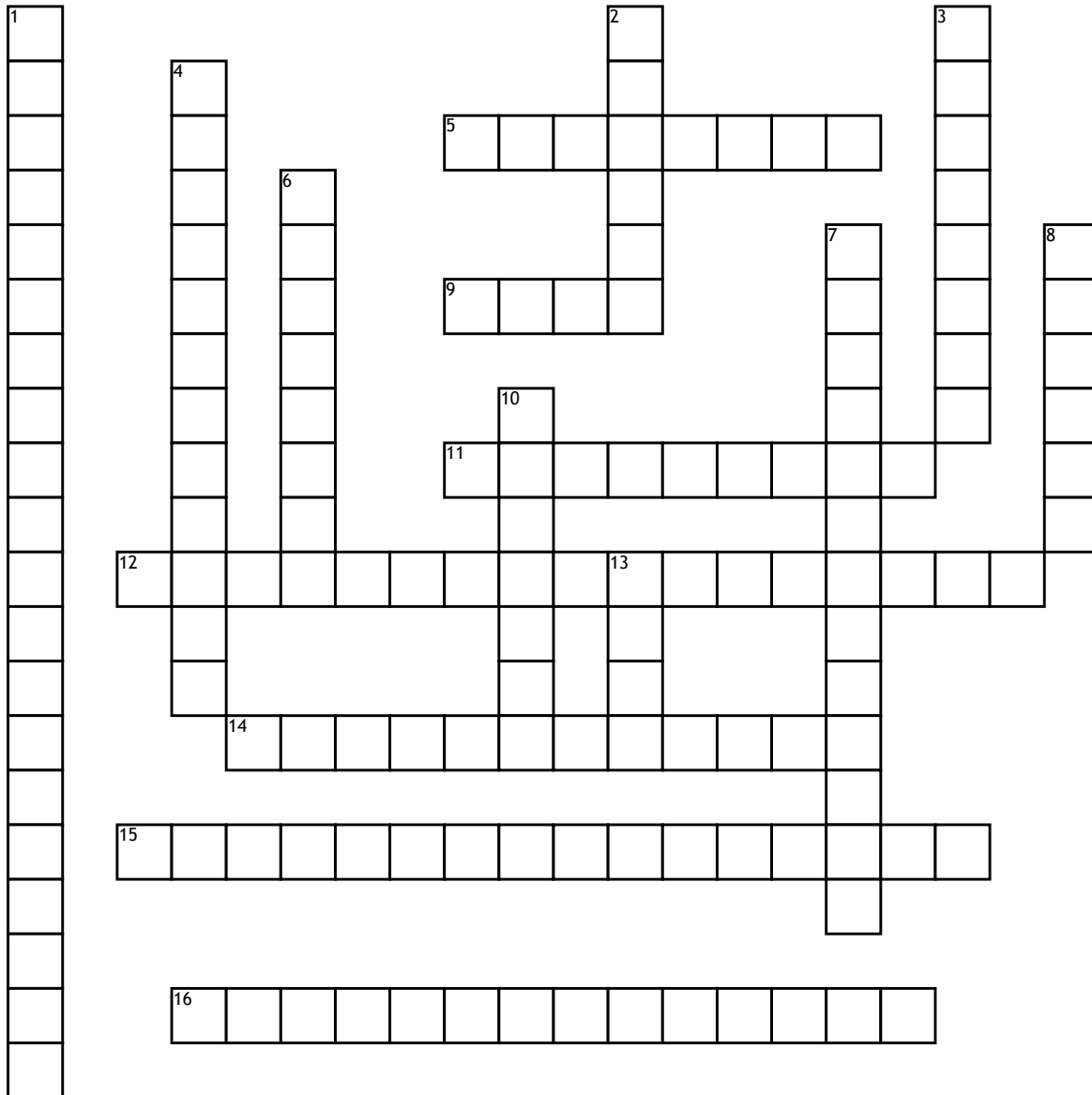


# All Things Critical Care 2



## Across

5. control according to Ramsey sedation scale

9. rapid onset of shortness of breath and very low oxygen levels in the blood.

11. increasing or decreasing a vasoactive drug or other critical infusion for therapeutic effect

12. Shortness of breath Chest pain Cough (it may be bloody, and there might be blood in the gunk you cough up) Pain in your back Much more sweating than usual A lightheaded feeling, or passing out, Blue lips or nails

14. the volume of blood pumped from the left ventricle per beat

15. a measurement of the percentage of blood leaving your heart each time it contracts

16. rapid administration of a bolus of fluid in critically ill, generally haemodynamically unstable patients who require rapid correction of an hypovolaemic

## Down

1. involves temporary or permanent damage to brain tissue

2. a potentially life-threatening condition caused by the body's response to an infection

3. Blank - inotropes are dopamine, dobutamine, epinephrine and norepinephrine

4. pumping muscles of the heart become too weak to circulate enough blood around the body

6. subarachnoid hemorrhage (SAH)

7. According to the most recent evidence, emergency treatment for a patient with a "warm and wet" presentation of acute decompensated heart failure should initially consist of IV furosemide (Lasix) and IV

8. blunt objects, stabbing, or shooting

10. Protect from light and Monitor serum Thiocyanate levels.

13. machine pumps blood from the patient's body to an artificial lung (oxygenator) that adds oxygen to it and removes carbon dioxide
