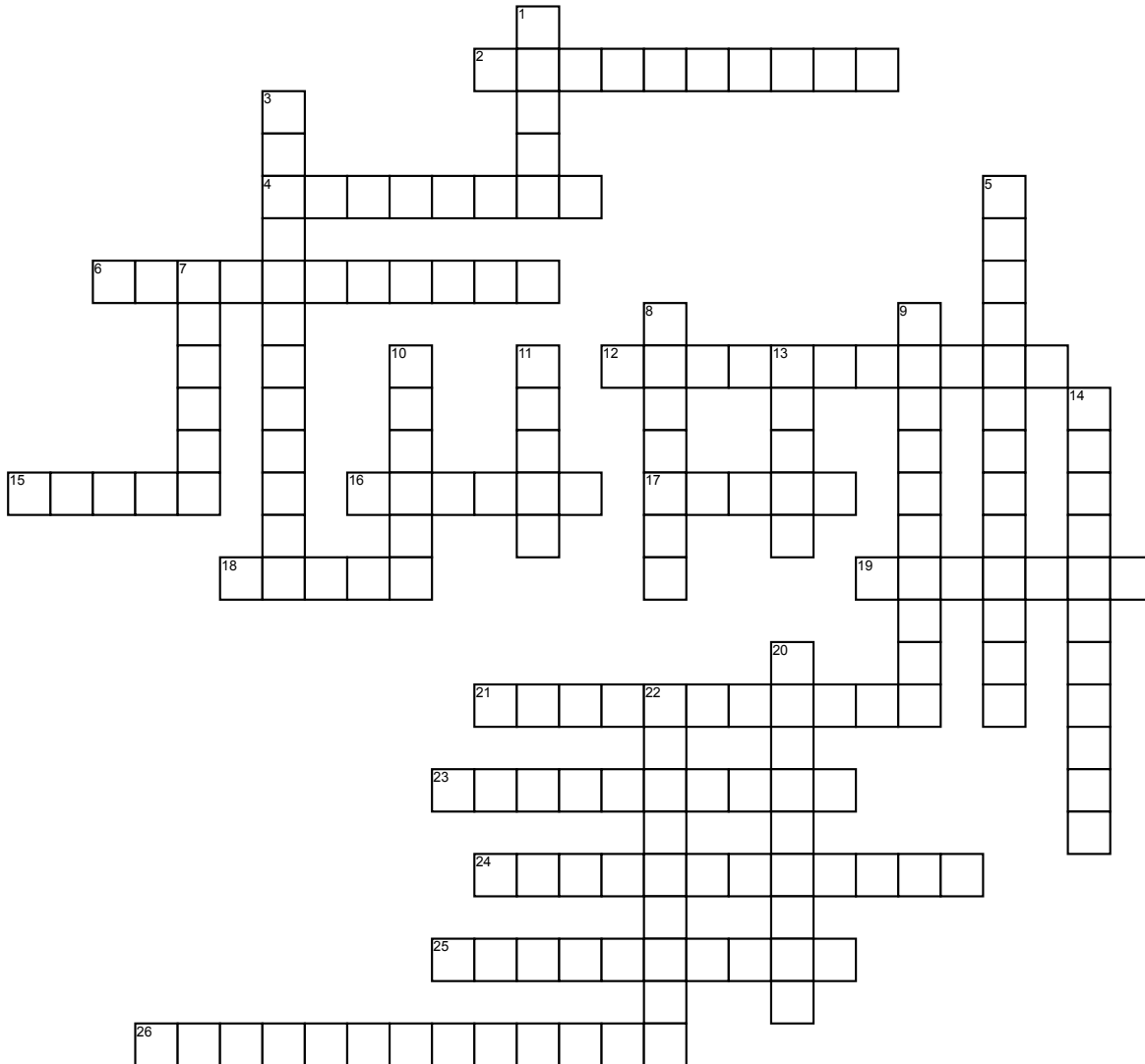

2. Imposing the federal prohibition of alcohol
4. Restricts the ability of individuals to bring suit against states in federal court.
6. Provide for citizens of the District of Columbia to vote for the President and Vice President offices.
12. Deals with issues related to presidential succession and disability.
15. Sets forth rights related to criminal prosecutions.
16. Enforced the notion that "each man's home is his castle", secure from unreasonable searches and seizures of property by the government.
17. Creates a number of rights to both civil and criminal proceedings.
18. Prohibits the involuntary quartering of soldiers in private homes.
19. Codifies the right to a jury trial in certain civil cases and inhibits courts from overturning a jury's findings of fact.

21. Prohibits the states and the federal government from using age as a reason for denying the right to vote to citizens.
23. Abolished slavery.
24. Limiting number of terms the president can serve.
25. Addresses a lot about citizenship and the rights of citizens.
26. Prohibits any law that increases or decreases the salary of members of Congress from taking effect until the start of the next term of office for Representatives.

1. Guarantees freedom
3. Prohibited the federal and state governments from imposing poll taxes before a citizen can participate in a federal election.
5. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each state, elected by the people.
7. Prohibits cruel and unusual punishments

9. Prohibits the states and the federal government from denying the right to vote to citizens of the United States on the basis of sex.

11. Addresses rights, retained by the people, that are not specifically enumerated in the Constitution.
13. Powers reserved to the states.

20. Prohibits the federal government and each state from denying a citizen the right to vote based on that citizen's race, color, or past condition of servitude.
22. Moved the beginning and ending of the terms of the president and vice president from March 4 to January 20, and of members of Congress from March 4 to January 3.
