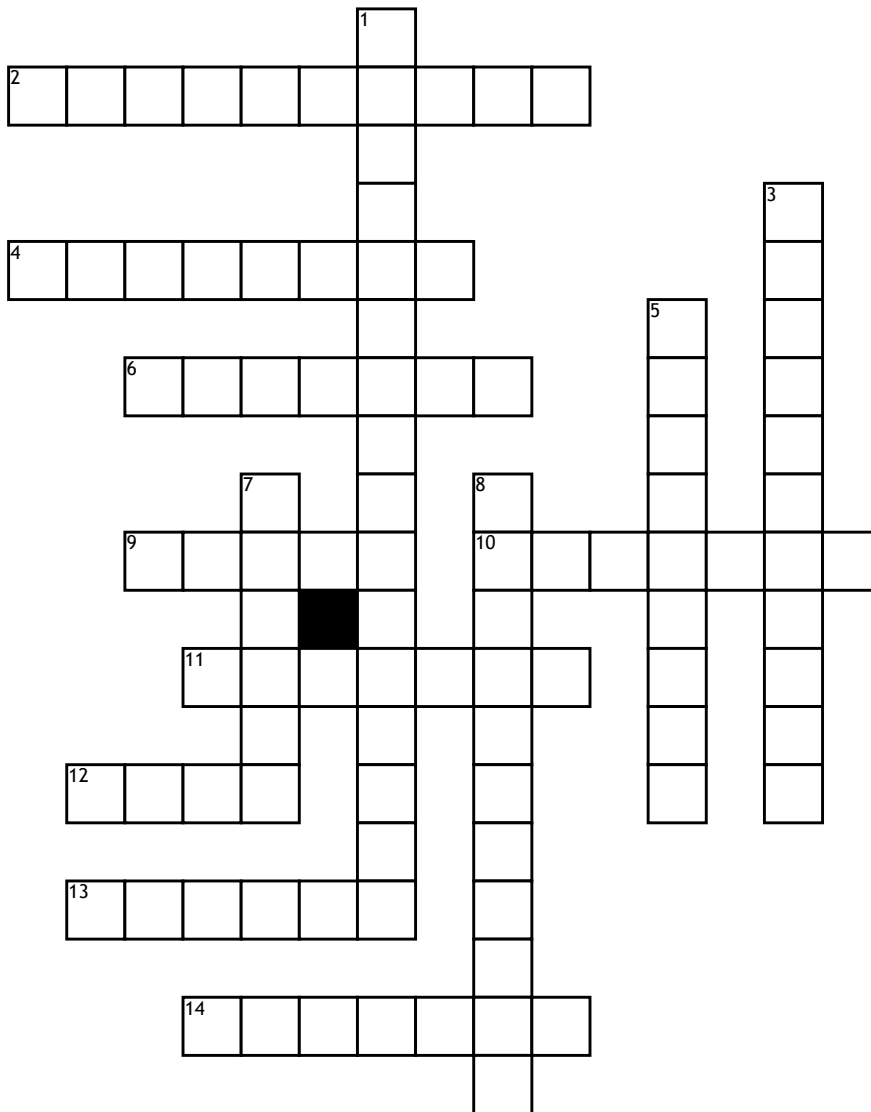


Ancient Egypt: Activity 3
