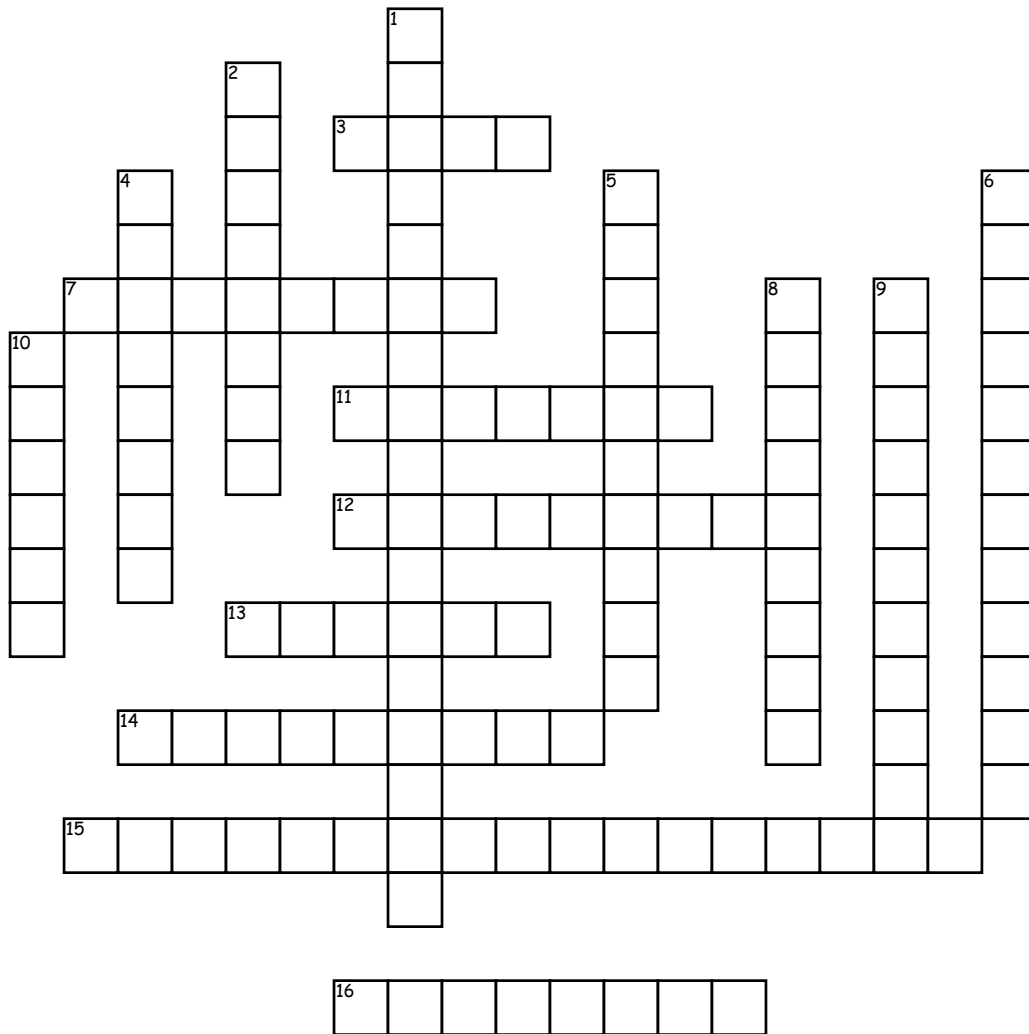

- 12. a member of the lower social classes.
- 13. an official appointed by a government to live in a foreign city and protect and promote the government's citizens and interests there

- 14. the restriction of the arbitrary exercise of power by subordinating it to well-defined and established laws.
- 15. which an organization or system is regulated, typically those ensuring that political power is not concentrated in the hands of individuals or groups.
- 16. a ruler with total power over a country, typically one who has obtained power by force.
