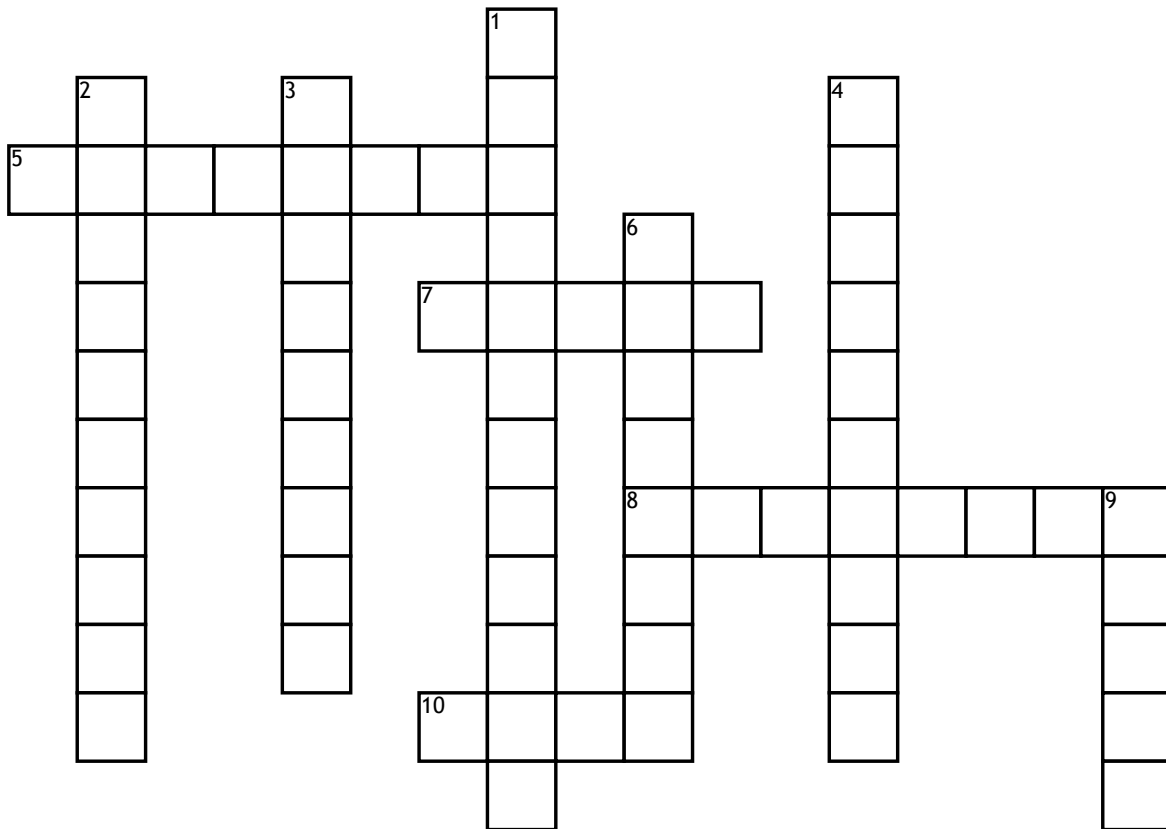


# Ankle and Foot Joint
