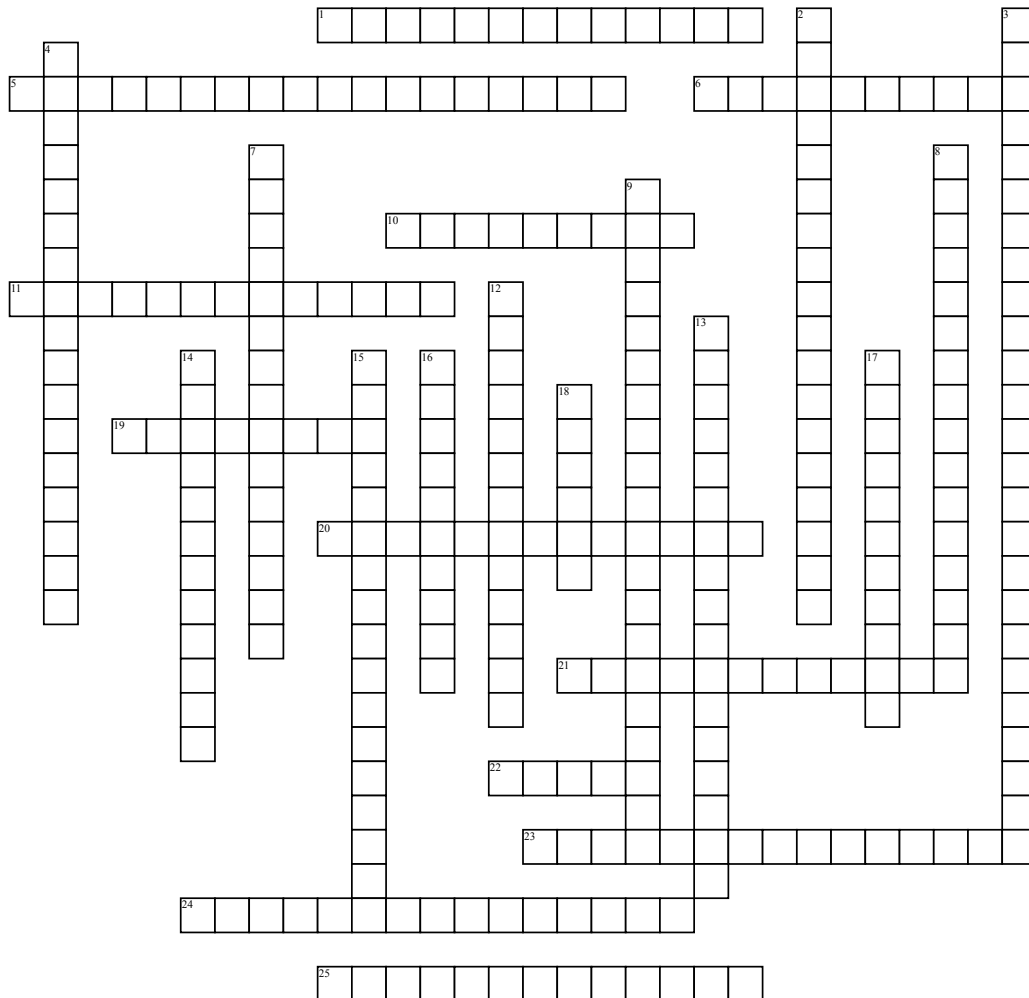

 2. Turning point of the War that made it clear the North would win. 50,000 people died, and the South lost its chance to invade the North.
 3. founded by Samuel Gompers; sought better wages, hrs, working conditions, etc
 4. This Act set up Kansas and Nebraska as states.
 7. A social theory that implies only the most competent individuals will survive and flourish with their companies in the market place
 8. American Party; major political force from 1854-1855; objective: to extend period of naturalization, undercut immigrant voting strengths, and keep aliens in their place

9. A suffragette who, with Lucretia Mott, organized the first convention on women's rights, held in Seneca Falls, New York in 1848.
 12. Farmers worked on land owned by someone else in return for a small portion of the crops.
 13. Prominent black American, born into slavery, who believed that racism would end once blacks acquired useful labor skills
 14. Act of 1862 that permitted any citizen or prospective citizen to claim 160 acres of public land and to purchase it for a small fee after living on it for five years.
 15. An attack on a village of sleeping Cheyenne Indians by a regiment of Colorado militiamen on 29 November 1864 that resulted in the death of more than 200 tribal members
 16. A procedure for submitting to popular vote measures passed by the legislature or proposed amendments to a state constitution.
 17. Journalists who exposed the ills of society, paved the way for progressivism
 18. A procedure for submitting to popular vote the removal of officials from office before the end of their term.
