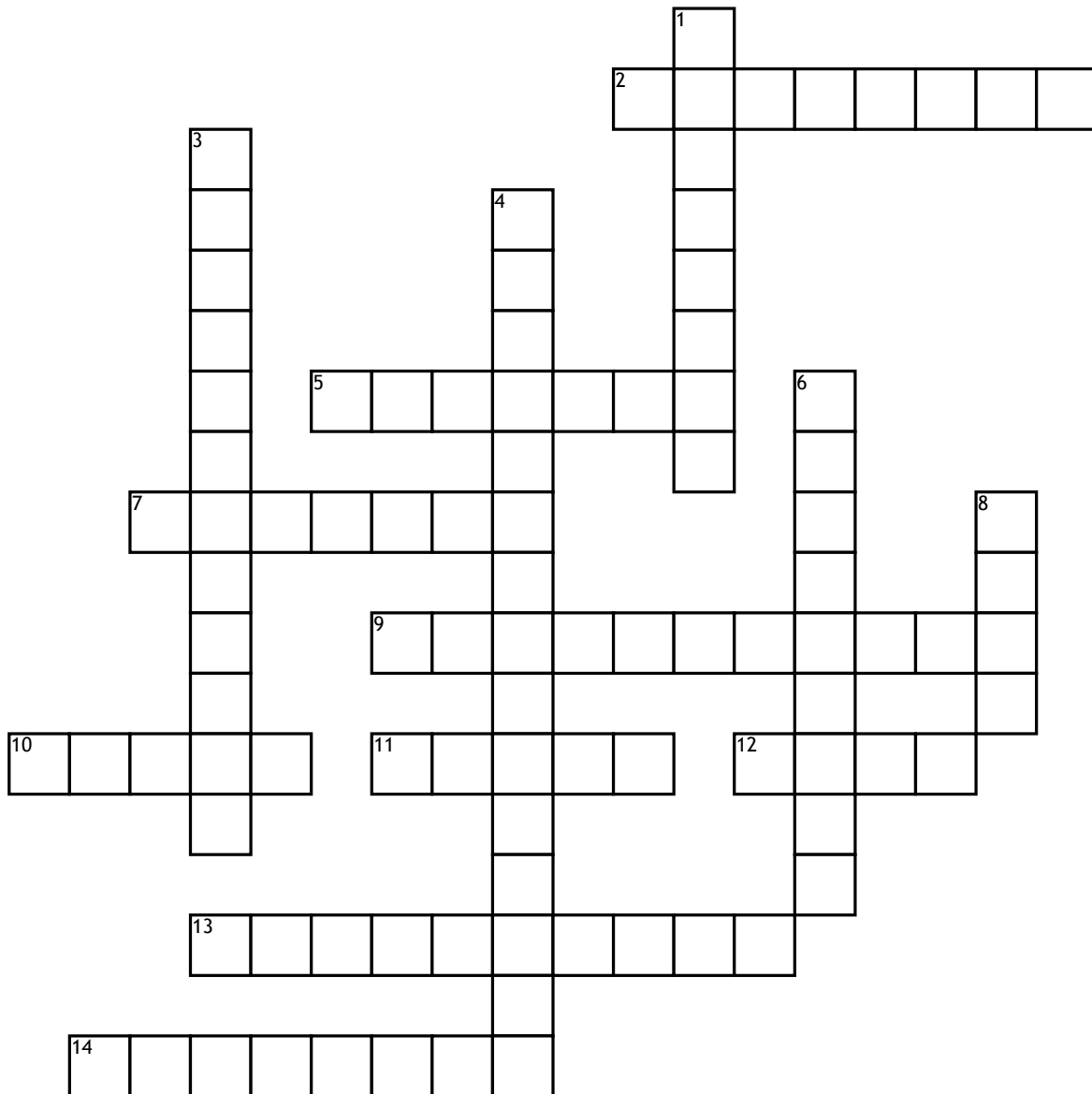


Argumentative Parts

- 5. a view or judgment formed about something, not necessarily based on fact or knowledge
- 7. base an argument, theory, or undertaking on
- 9. when one's reasoning and thoughts about something coincide with the realistic possibilities; logical fallacy

- 10. state or assert that something is the case, typically without providing evidence or proof
- 11. one's rational thought about something;
- 12. prejudice in favor of or against one thing, person, or group compared with another, usually in a way considered to be unfair
- 13. not connected with or relevant to something
- 14. information that is important and needed to defend your point of view on a subject
