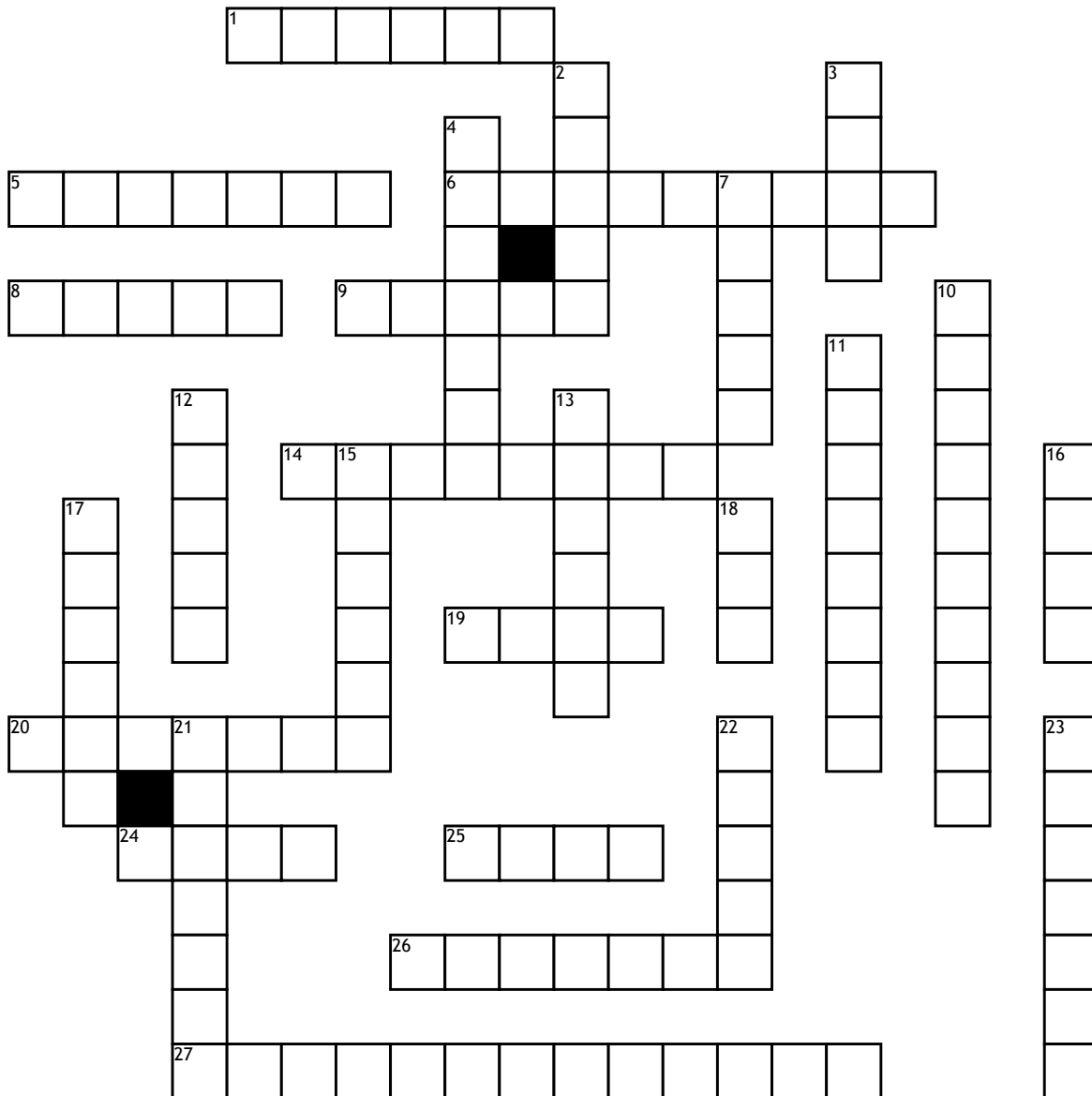


# Art Extra Credit



## Across

1. created by the careful placement of repeated elements in a work of art to cause a visual tempo or beat
5. a way of using similar elements in a repeated manner
6. A set of colors next to each other on the color wheel
8. The visual appearance of an object determined by the reflection of lightwaves
9. two-dimensional figures that have height and width, but no depth. Can be organic or geometric
14. the path the viewer's eye takes through the work of art, often to focal areas; can be directed along lines, edges, shape, and color within the work of art
19. A color set that includes Greens, Blues, and Violets
20. the surface quality of an object
24. An element of art used to define shape, contours, and outlines

25. the three-dimensionality of an object; has height and width and depth

26. A way of combining similar elements in an artwork to accent their similarities

27. 2 colors across from each other on a color wheel

2. the space inside, around, and above a sculpture or object
3. This color can not be made by mixing colors together
4. where the elements used on one side of the design are similar to those on the other side
7. This color is made by mixing Blue and Yellow together
10. A color set that uses all of the values of 1 color
11. the part of the design that catches the viewer's attention, made by contrasting it with other areas
12. the range of lightness and darkness of colors

13. This color can not be made by mixing colors together

15. This color is made by mixing Red and Yellow together

16. A color set that includes Reds, Oranges, and Yellows

17. This color is made by mixing Red and Blue together

18. This color can not be made by mixing colors together

21. A color set that uses 3 colors that are equidistant from each other on the color wheel

22. the arrangement of the elements and principles of art to create a feeling of completeness or wholeness

23. the use of several elements of design to hold the viewer's attention and to guide the viewer's eye through and around the work of art
