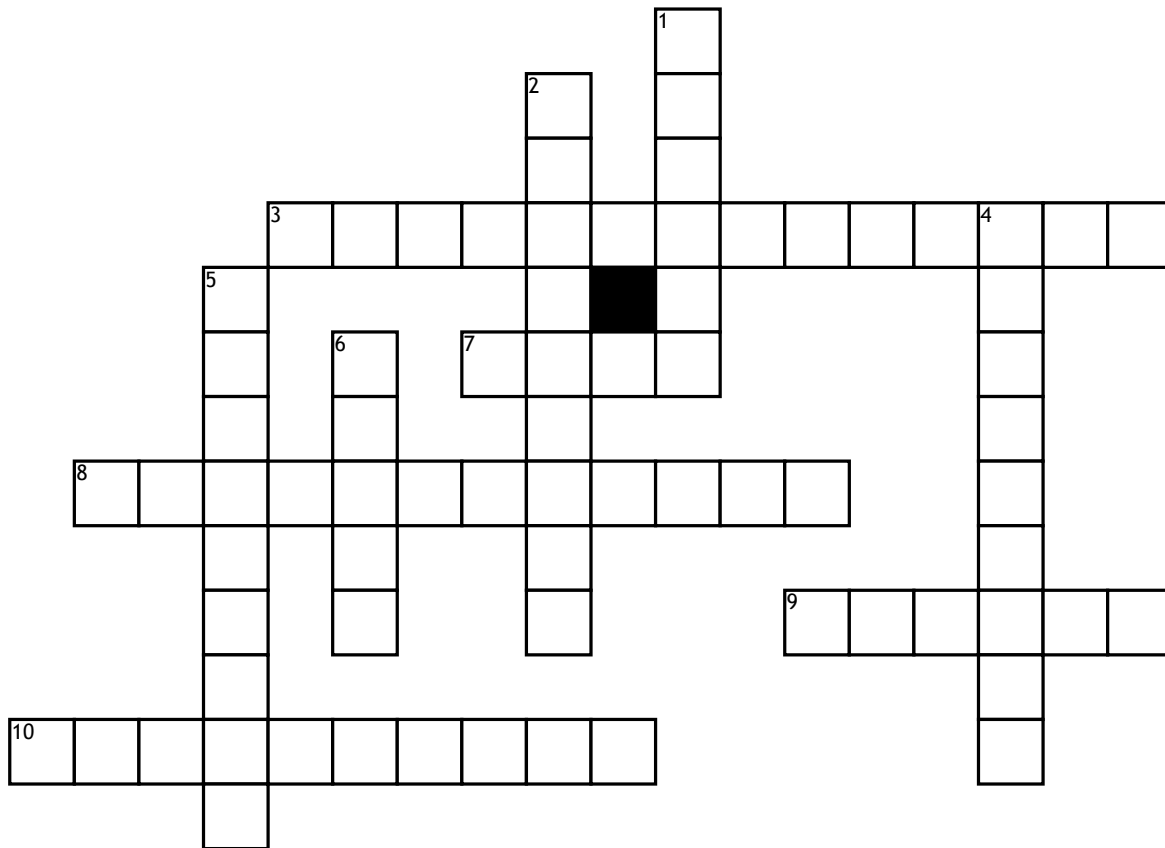

3. A ranking of courts from lowest to highest in order of the seriousness of the type of case they can determine.

7. A group of randomly selected citizens who are called to determine the verdict in a criminal.

8. Legal dispute in which an individual has committed an illegal act that inflicts harm another and is taken to court by State or Govt

9. Verdict in a criminal case where the accused has found to have committed an offence.

10. An accused person being taken to court by the state or government of behalf of society.

1. A statement of principles and aims that will shape future decision making.

2. The verdict in a criminal trial where the accused is found to not have committed a crime.

4. Laws made by judges or the courts.

5. A legal dispute where an individual alleges another has breached their rights.

6. A hearing to resolve and determine the outcome in a criminal or civil dispute heard in the country or supreme court.
