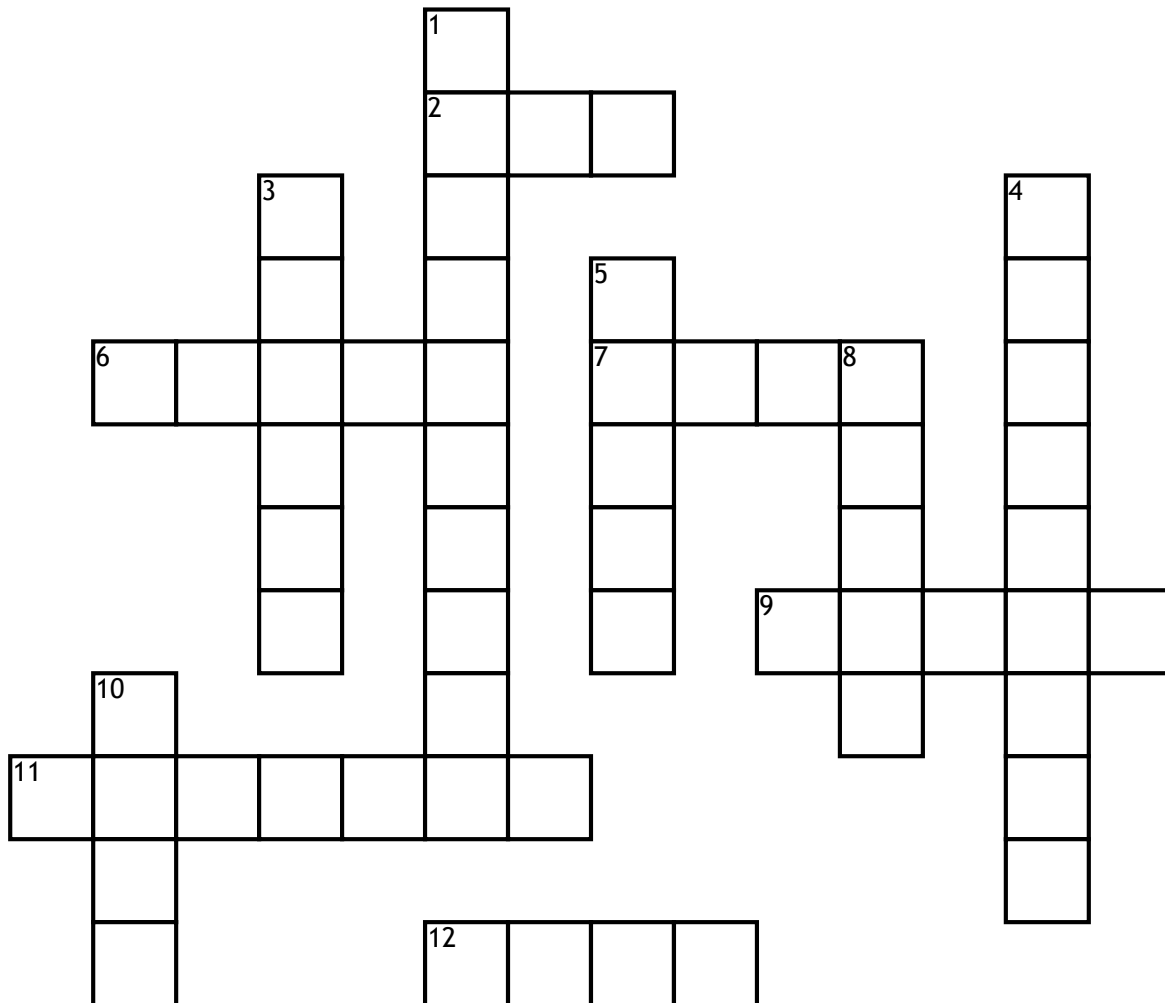


Basic Stage Lighting

2. A white wall, or drape from which to project images or color.
 6. A measure of the raw amount of light a fixture (or lamp) produces.
 7. The object inside a fixture that creates the light.
 9. A screen that basically acts as a two way mirror.
 11. A light with one specific purpose.

12. A technique that uniformly lights a surface. Accomplished with low angle front light aimed nearly perpendicular to the surface to be lit.

1. The area in which acting is taking place, where there is light.
 3. The electromagnetically controlled device that dims the lights.
 4. A lamp that is already on stage and it is a visible source.

5. Any fixture or lamp that has a 25 degree or higher beam angle. Also refers to a lighting technique using such fixtures that washes a surface with a large area of light.

8. How you connect the circuit to the dimmer.

10. Any fixture or lamp that has a beam angle below 25 degrees. Also refers to a lighting technique using such fixtures that provide a tight area of light on a surface.
