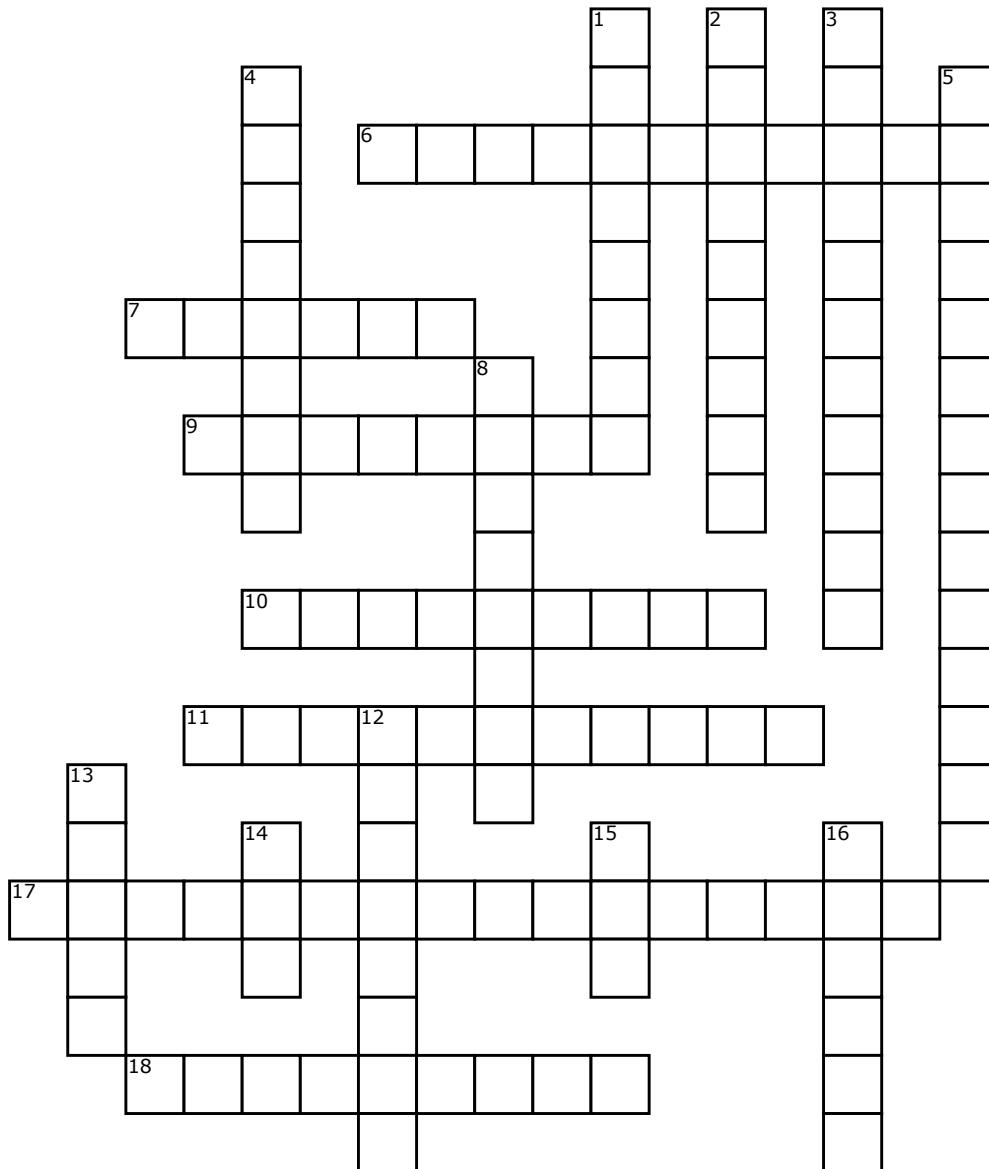

- 1.** is normally short, to the point, and to illustrate a bulletin or news item

- 4.** the person that oversees productions and the execution of administrative duties for broadcast stations.
