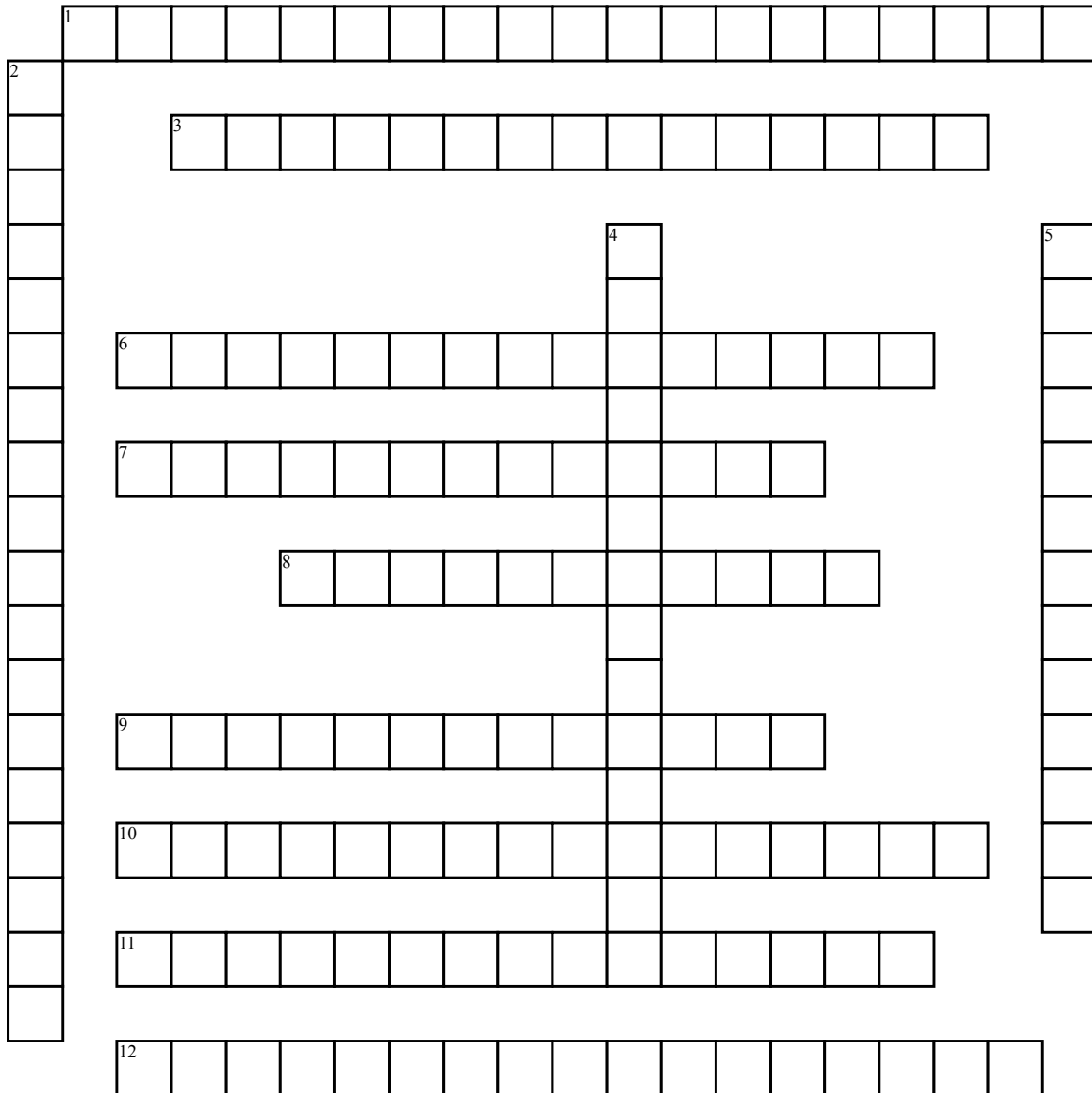

- 1. An assumption is a statement that is presumed to be true without concrete evidence to support it.
- 3. Criminal liability of a police officer can be defined as the fact that some actions that a police officer can take are crimes. A police officer who takes such an action can be charged with a crime.
- 6. Balancing individual freedom and governmental power
- 7. Framework, set of rules, procedural steps, or test, often established through precedent in the common law, through which judgments can be determined in a given legal case. A doctrine comes about when a judge makes a ruling where a process is outlined and applied, and allows for it to be equally applied to like cases.

- 8. Officers person who has frequent contact with the public, has little supervision but has great impact on their clients
- 9. The act of a person who pleads. Law. the advocating of a cause in a court of law. the art or science of setting forth or drawing pleas in legal causes. a formal statement, usually written, setting forth the cause of action or defense of a case.
- 10. Identifies conflicts between individuals, corporations, government bodies, and other organizations
- 11. Settled out of court after agreements or mediation between the two parties. Someone who becomes sick from chemicals found in bottled water can file a product liability suit.
