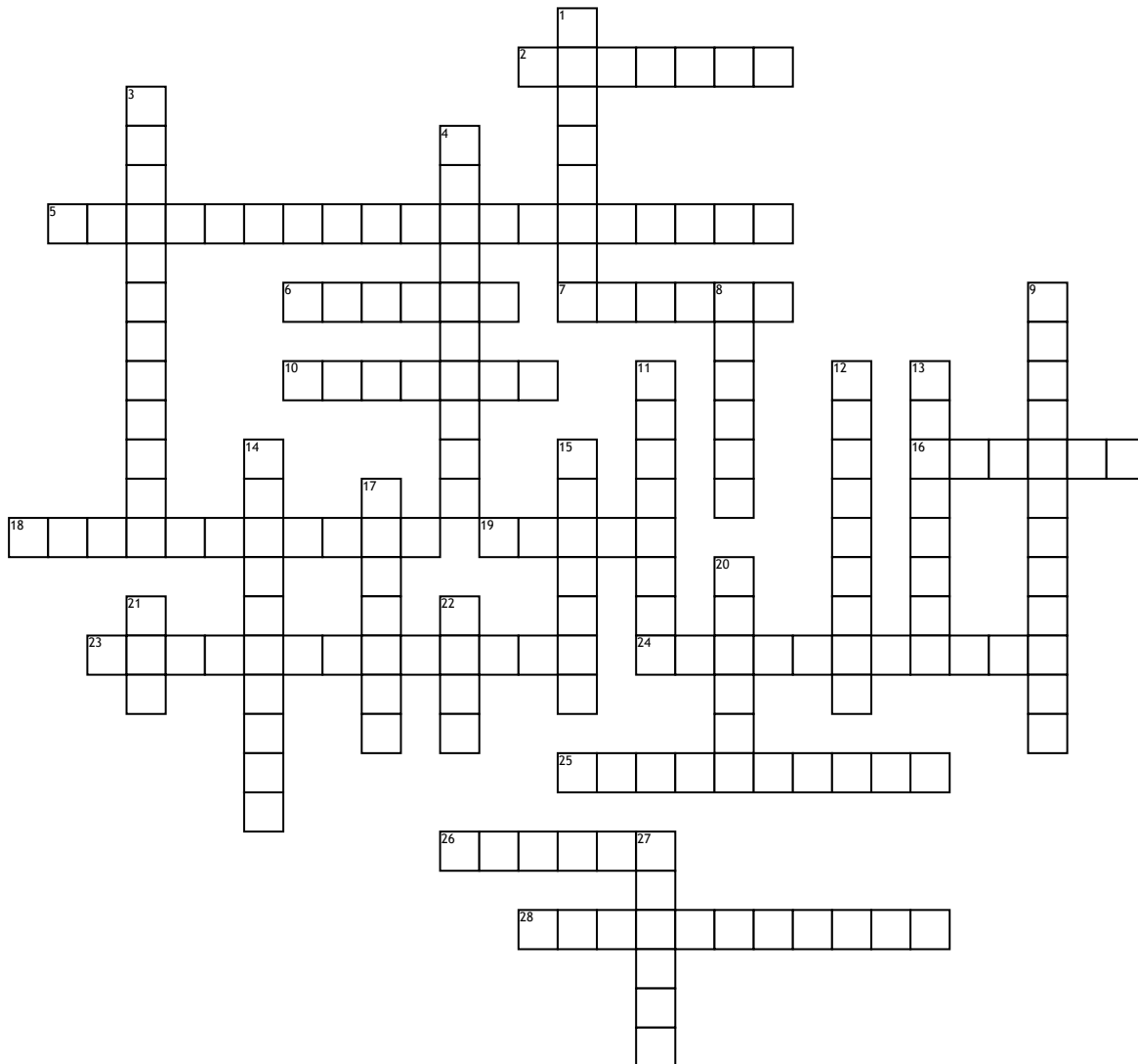


CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATIONS
