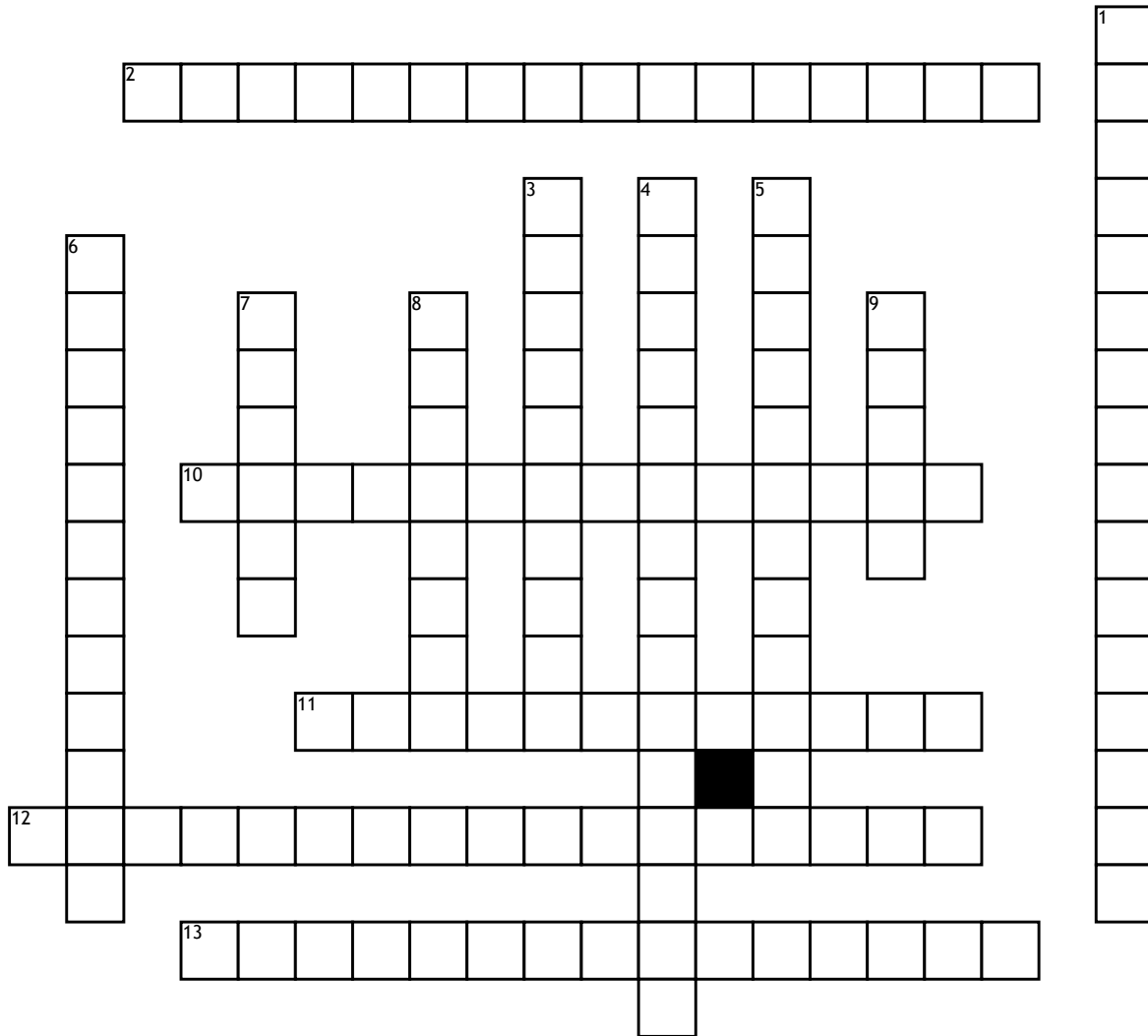


Calvary, Forts, and Indians

- 1. Forts to guard emigrants to Texas.

- 5. Part of a series of forced relocations of about 100,000 Native Americans between 1830 and 1850 by the United States government known as the Indian removal.
- 6. Last Chief of the Comanches, never last lost a battle to white men, but did accept reservation life.
