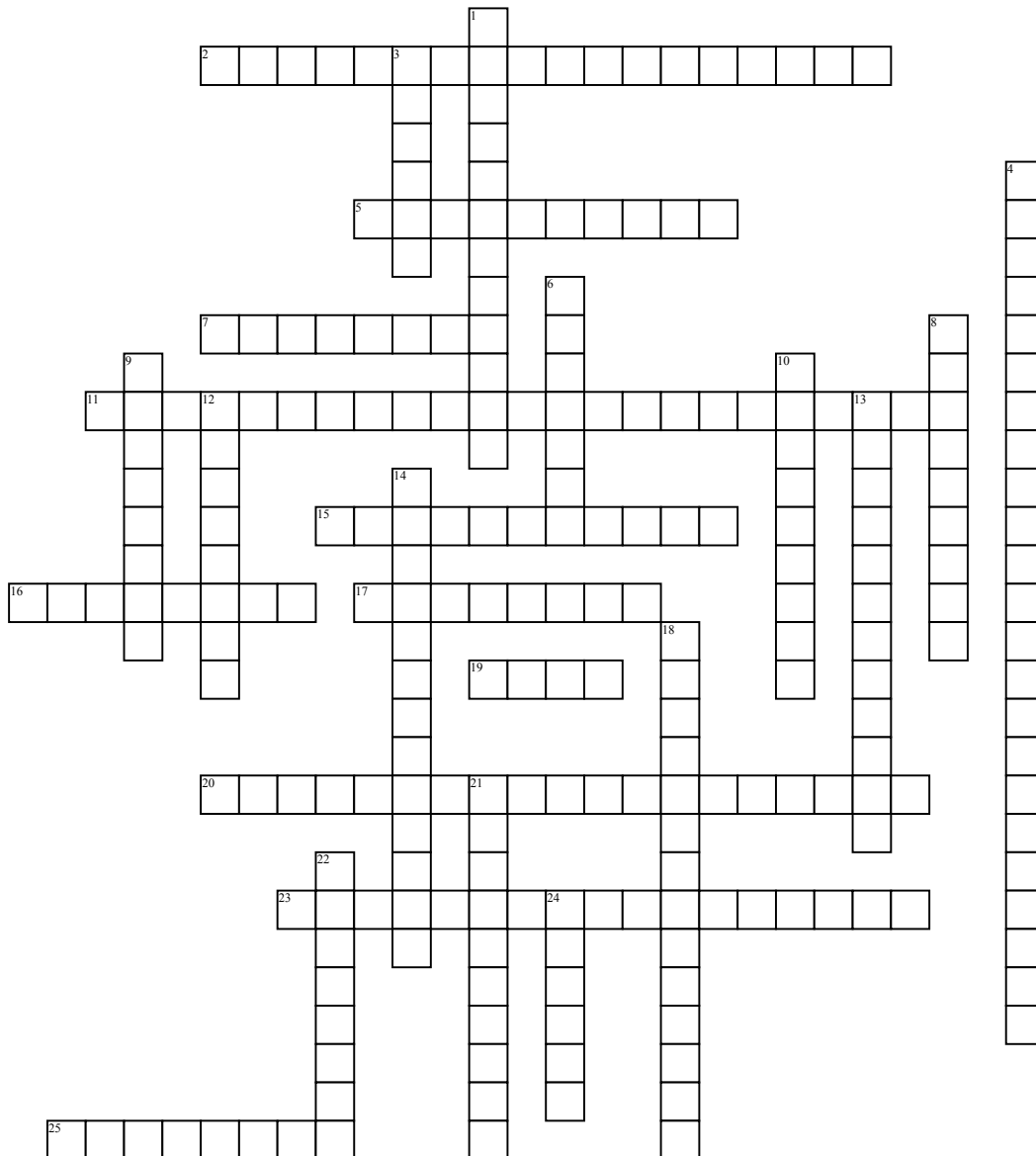


Care of Elderly Patients
