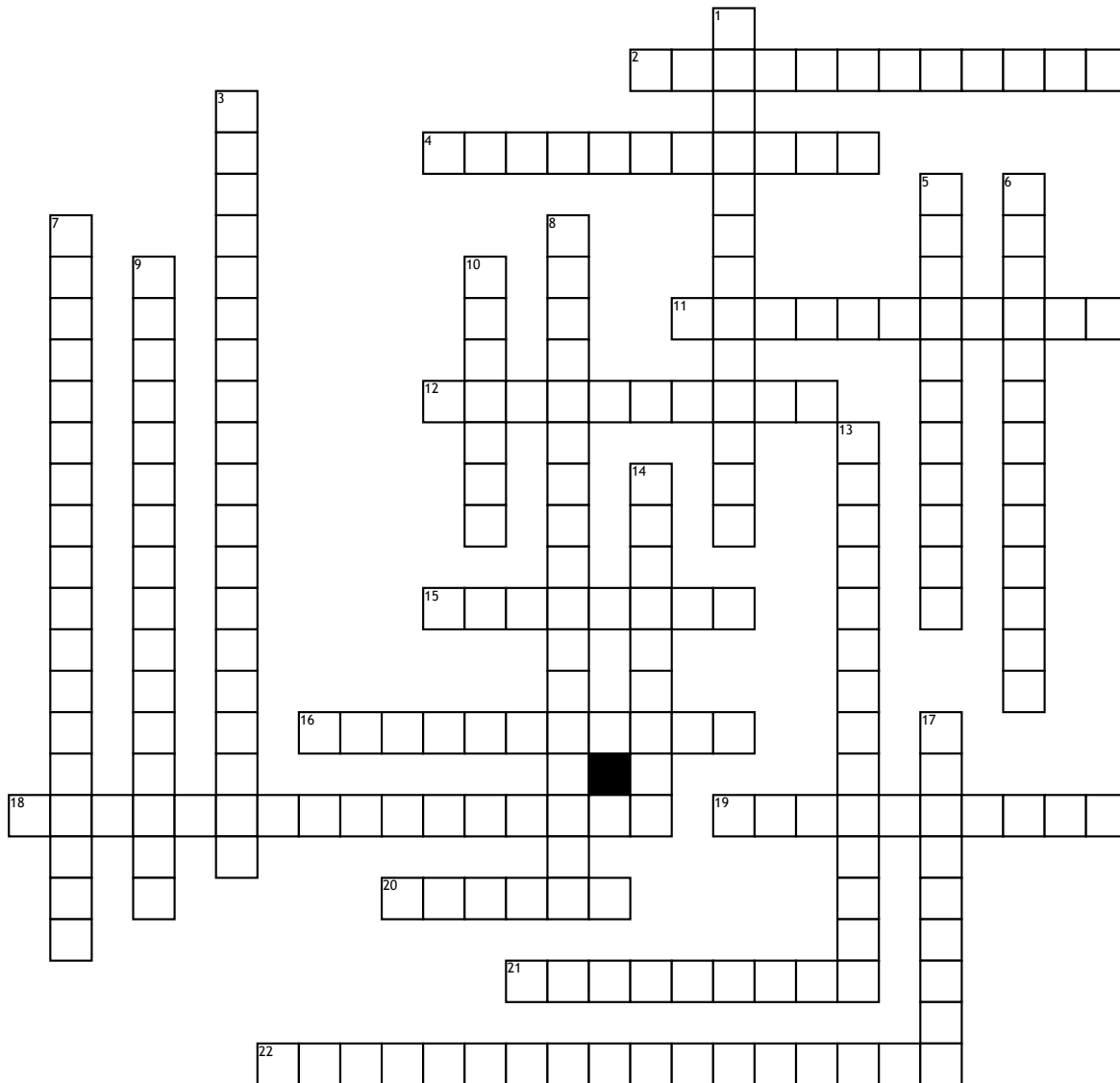


# Categories of Law
