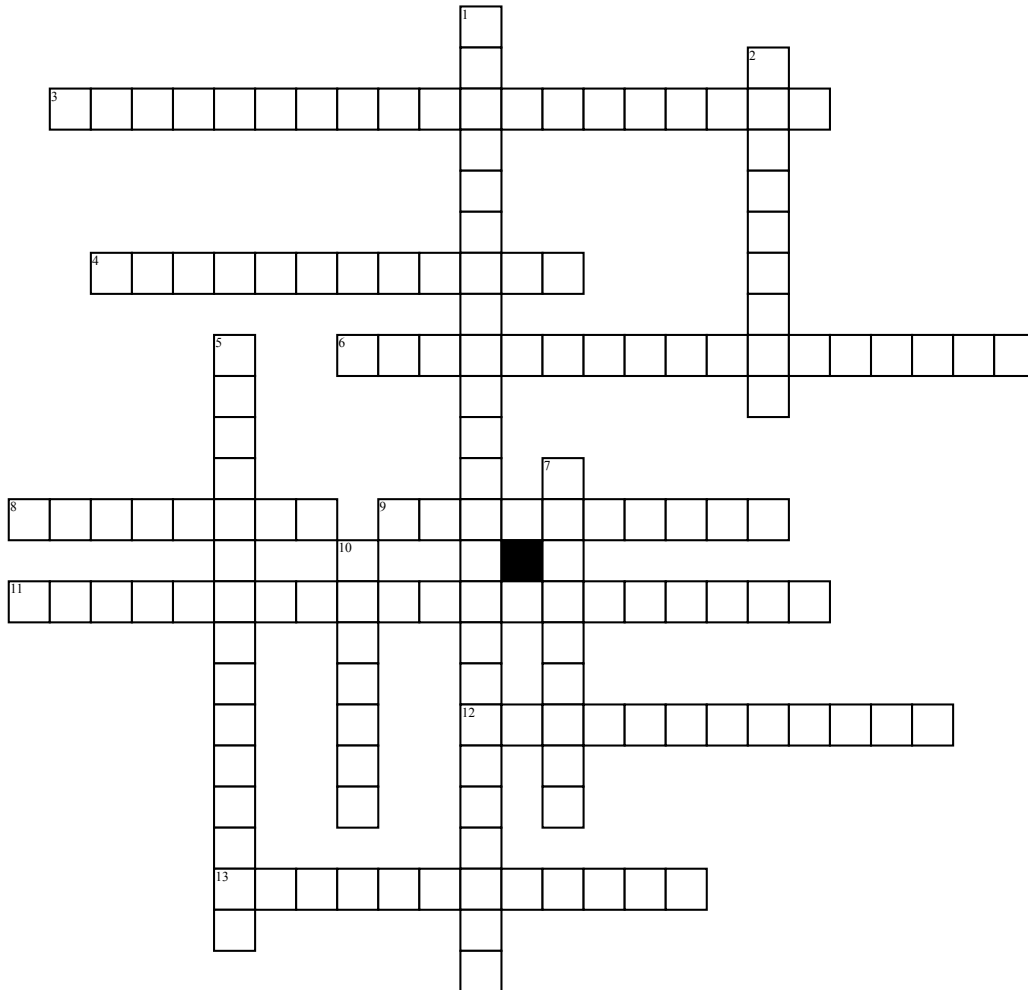


Chapter 11 The Civil War

- 3. An amendment to the U.S. constitution, adopted in 1865, that has abolished slavery and involuntary servitude.
- 4. A court order requiring authorities to bring a prisoner before the court so that the court can determine whether the prisoner is being held legally.
- 6. A famous speech delivered by Abraham Lincoln in November 1863, at the dedication of a national cemetery on the site of the battle of Gettysburg

- 8. An international organization that provides relief to people in times of war or natural disaster. Clara Barton founded the American branch in 1881
- 9. A northern democrat who advocated making peace with the confederacy during the civil war.
- 11. Town near Appomattox, Virginia where Lee surrendered to Grant on April 9th, 1865 thus ending the civil war (37°N 79°W)
- 12. A three part strategy by which the union proposed to defeat the confederacy in the civil war.
- 13. The drafting of citizens for military service.

- 1. An executive order issued by Abraham Lincoln on January 1st, 1863, freeing the slaves in all regions behind confederate lines.
- 2. A tax on earnings
- 5. Legislation passed in 1863 to make banking safer for investors. Its provisions included a system of federally chartered banks, new requirements for loans, and a system for the inspection of banks.
- 7. An ironclad ship used by the south in the civil war
- 10. An ironclad ship used by the north in the civil war
