 3. Refusal to give up bus seat sparked the Montgomery bus boycott
 4. Upheld segregation laws in public places under "separate but equal" doctrine
 5. Received a call to stay in the black neighbor motel and was killed the next day
 6. Clarence M. Mitchell helped this organization pass the Civil Rights Acts of 1957, 1964, and 1968
 7. African-American organization who's main goal was to advance civil rights non-violently
 8. Non-violent protests in Greensboro, NC
 9. The town that hosted nine African-American students in an all white school
 10. Organization started by Ella Baker at Shaw University
