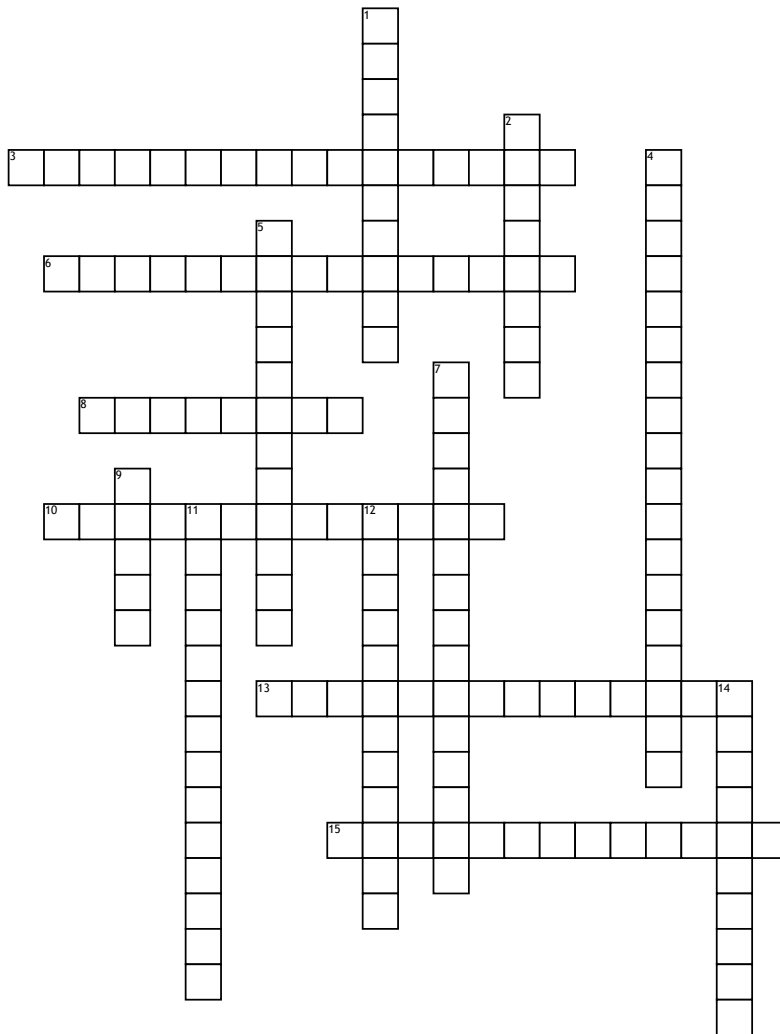


# Chapter 3-The colonies come of age
