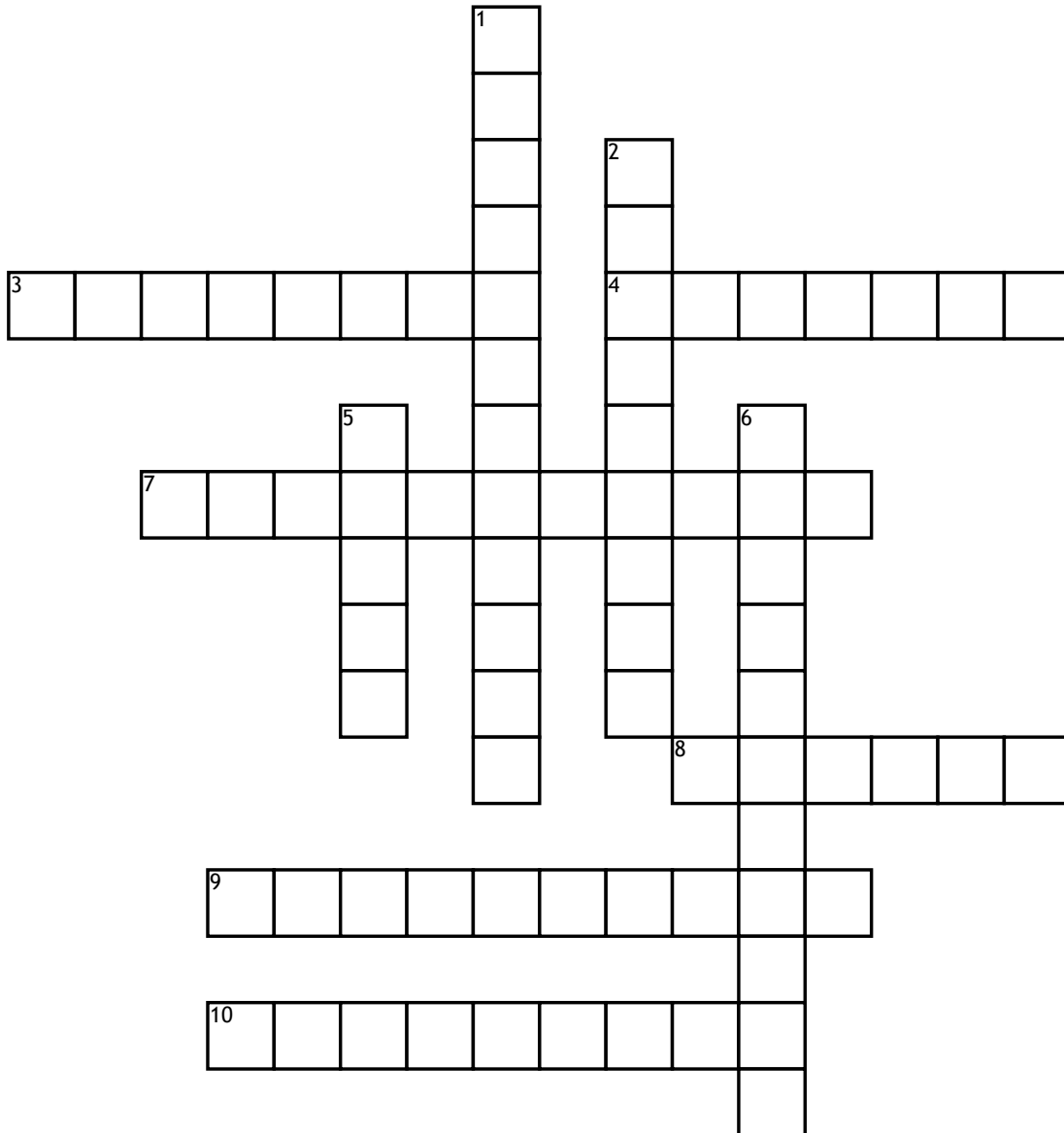


Chapter 3 & 4: The View from Saturday
