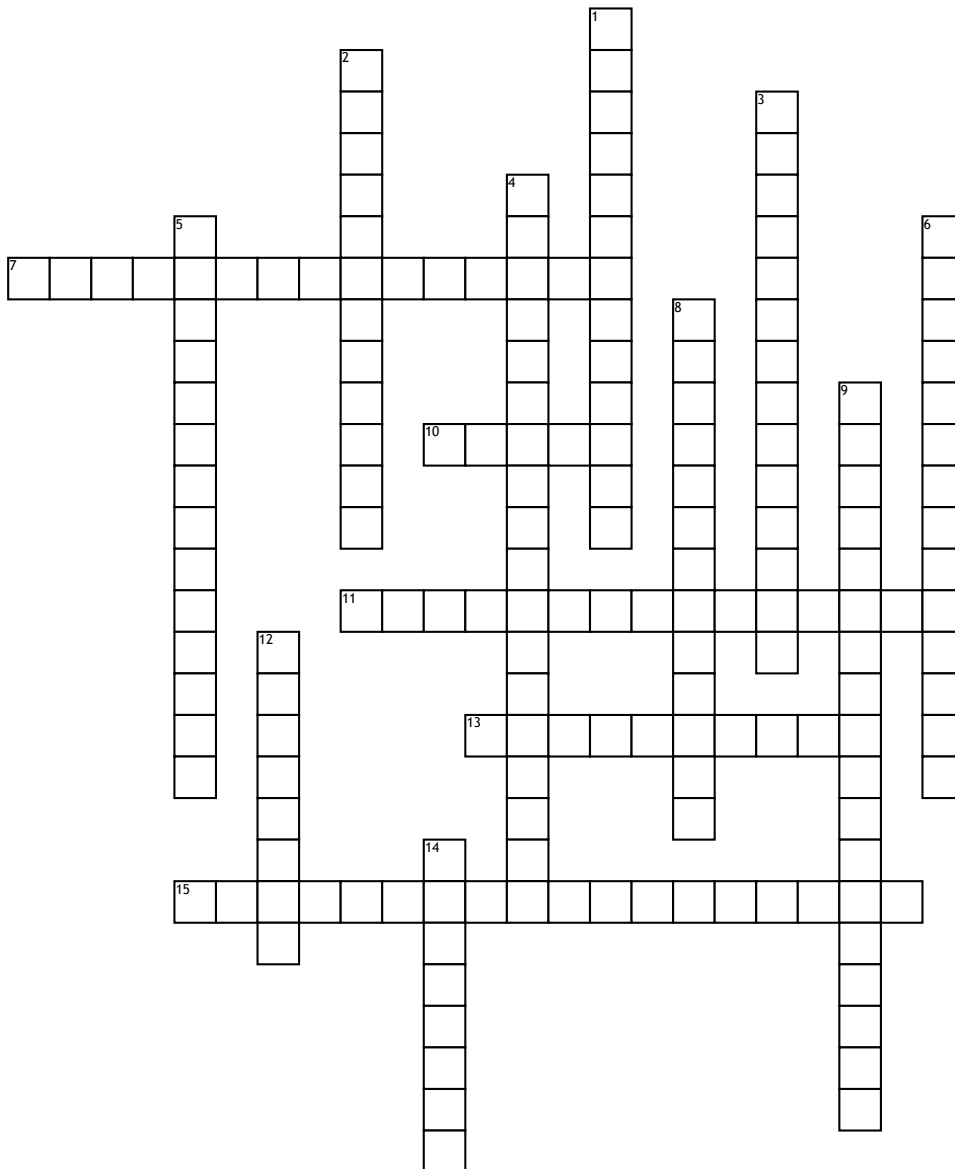

1. An 18th-century intellectual movement that emphasized the use of reason and the scientific method as means of obtaining knowledge

2. "held that a country's ultimate goal was self-sufficiency and that all countries were in a competition to acquire the most gold and silver."

3. A series of laws enacted by parliament, beginning in 165, to tighten England's control of trade in its American colonies

4. A conflict in North America, lasting from 1754-1763, that was a part of a worldwide struggle between France and Britain and that ended with the defeat of France and the transfer of French Canada to Britain

5. A 1753 uprising of slaves in South Carolina, leading to the tightening of already harsh slave laws

6. A revival of religious feeling in the American Colonies during the 1730's and 1750's

8. The voyage that brought enslaved Africans to the West Indies and later to North America

9. An order in which Britain prohibited its American colonist from settling west of the Appalachian Mountains

12. A crop grown by a farmer for sale rather than for personal use

14. A trade law enacted by parliament in 1764 in an attempt to reduce smuggling in the British colonies in North America
