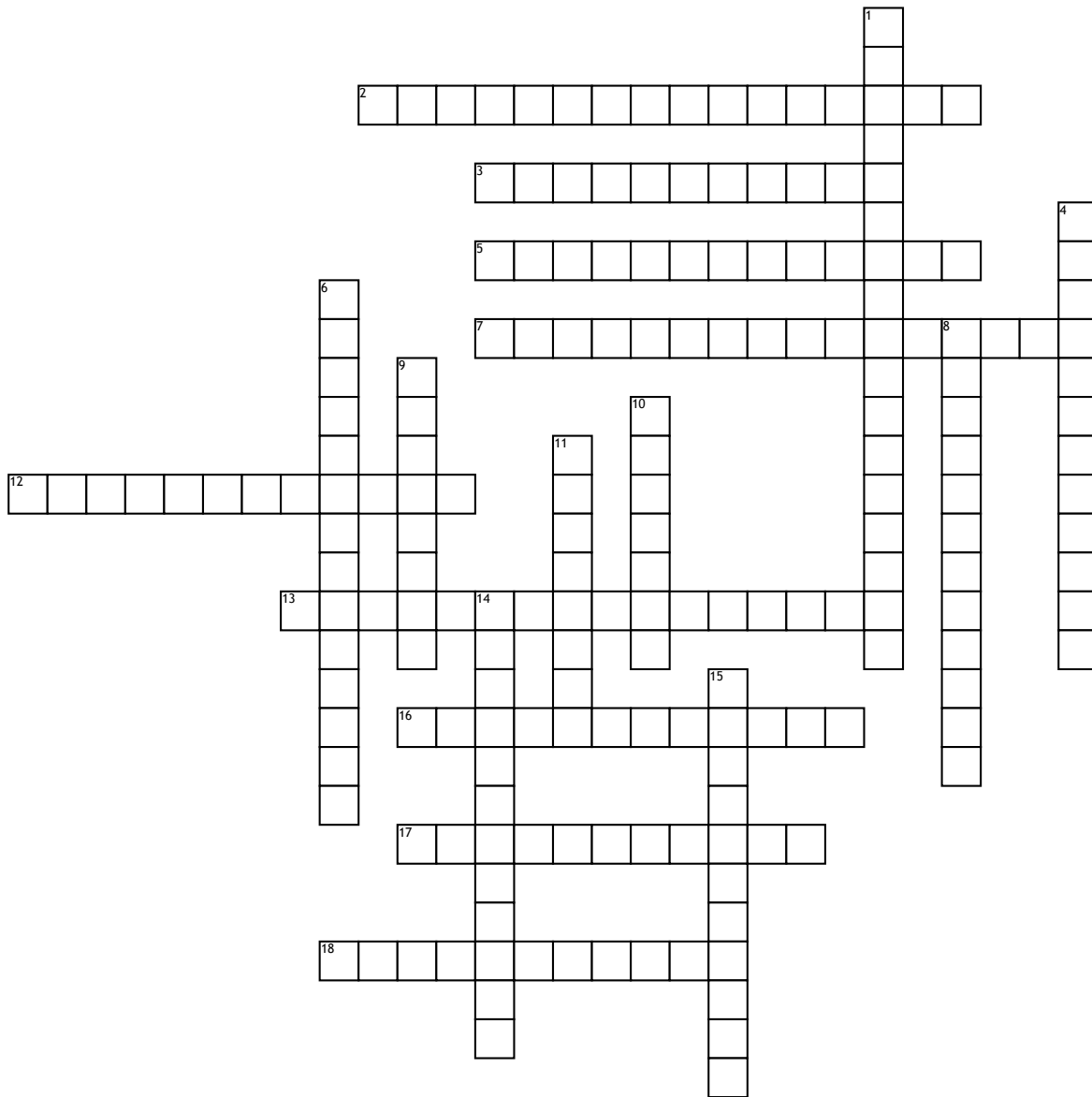


Chapter 5 Cabinetry Styles I

- 5. furnishings that combine colonial and plain styles with curved edges, turnings, & bent woods
- 7. style of furniture with graceful, curved edges
- 12. measure of how well a room matches a historic, original room

- 13. style used to describe pieces from 1620 to about 1790
- 16. a table with legs that swing out to support hinged table leaves
- 17. characteristics that includes spindly, square, straight legs
- 18. first american designer to adapt European and asian styles
