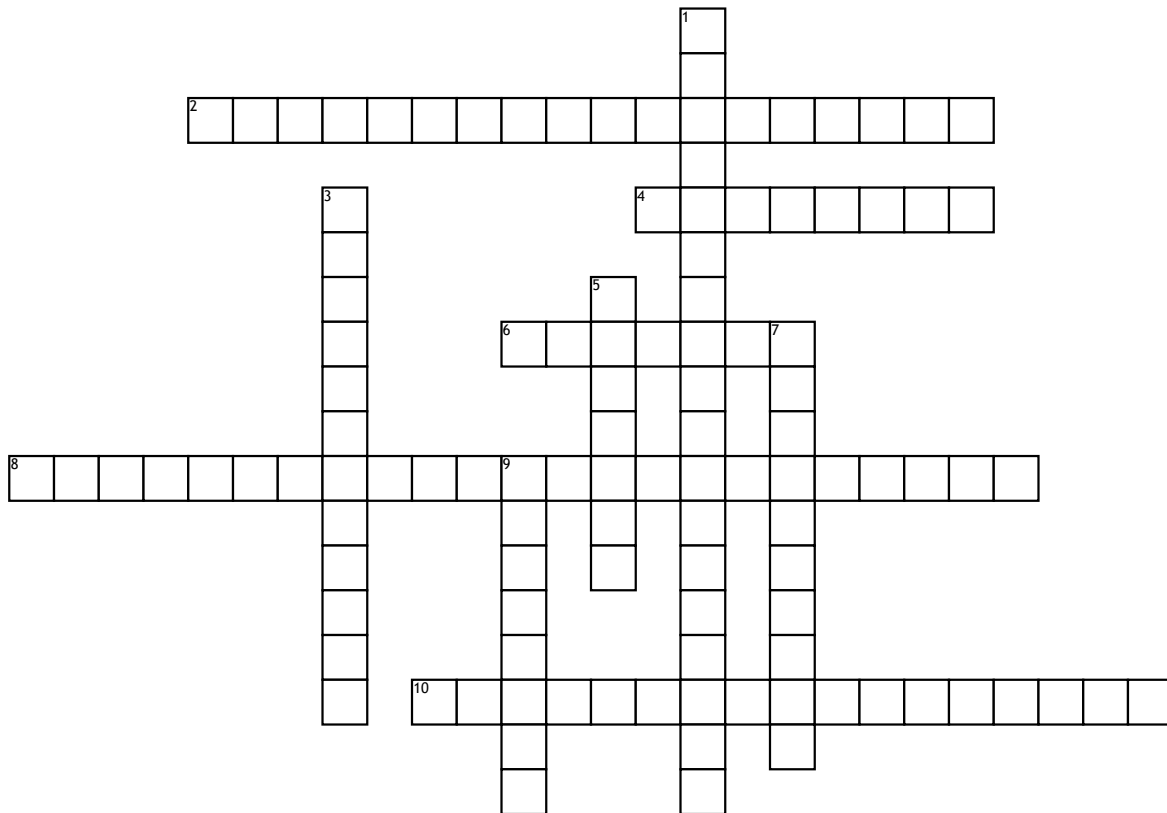


Chapter 5 Definitions & Terminology

2. Designation of areas at a hazardous materials incident based on safety and the degree of hazard.
4. The control zone at a hazardous materials incident site where personnel and equipment decontamination (decon) and hot zone support takes place.
6. The control zone immediately surrounding a hazardous material incident that extends far enough to prevent adverse effects from hazardous materials releases to personnel outside the zone.
8. The strategy used by the IC to protect the general population from the hazardous material by the implementing a strategy of Protection in Place, Evacuation, or a combination of both.
10. Directing people to go inside a building, seal it up as effectively as possible, and remain inside the building until the danger from a hazardous materials releases has passed.

1. The designated crowd control line surrounding the hazard control zones.
3. A holding area within the hot zone where personnel are controlled until they can be safely decontaminated, treated, or removed.
5. The National Incident Management System defines this as the location where resources can be placed while awaiting a tactical assignment.
7. The controlled relocation of people from an area of known danger or unacceptable risk to a safer area or one in which the risk is considered acceptable.
9. The areas at a hazardous materials incident that contains the incident command post (ICP) and other support functions necessary to control the incident.
