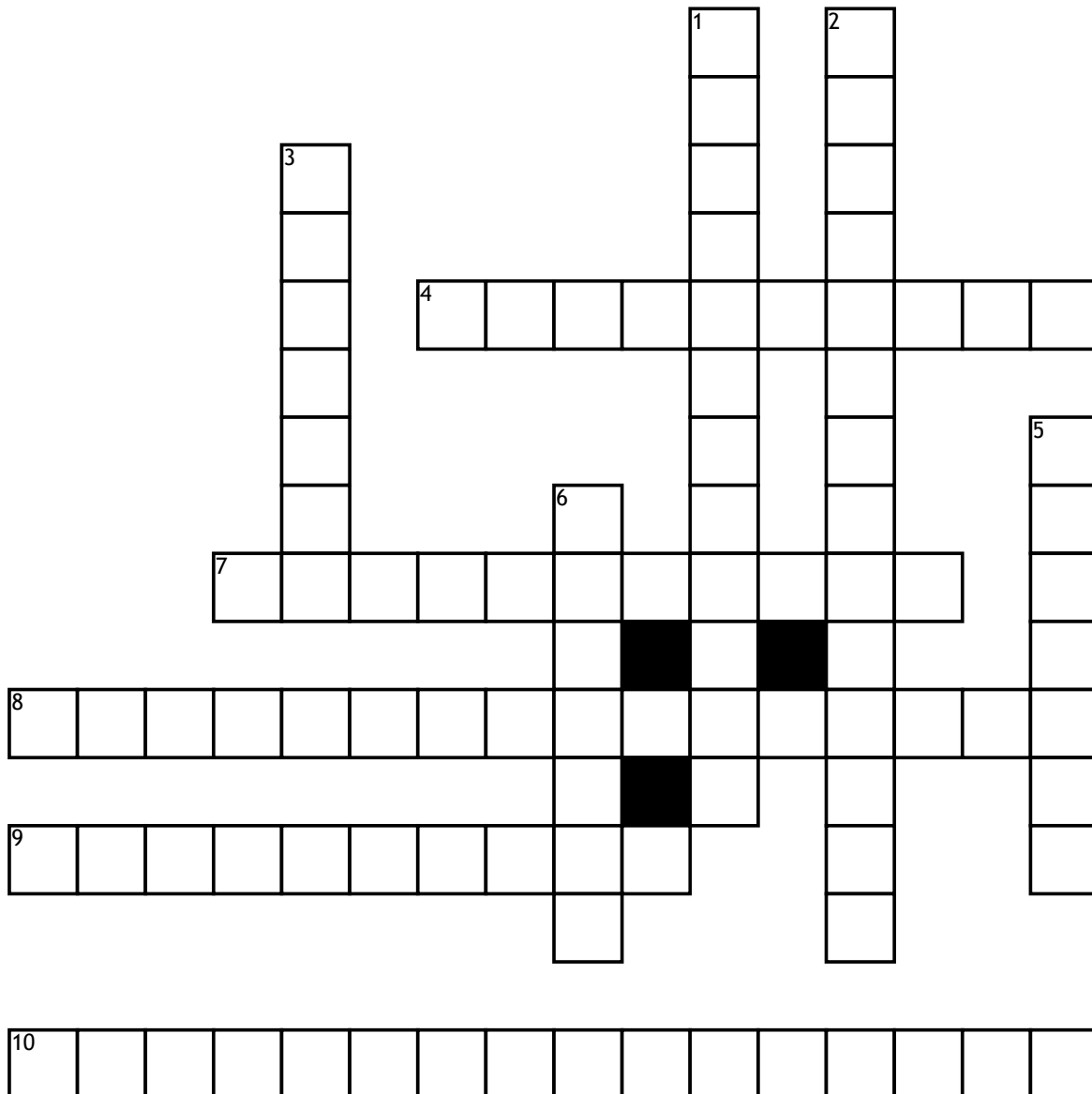

- 4. The taking of nutrients and drugs into the body from food and liquids
- 7. The final evacuation of a drug or other substance from the body via normal body processes, such as kidney elimination (urine), biliary excretion (bile to stool) sweat, respiration, or saliva
- 8. Nonprescription drugs that are kept behind the pharmacy counter; limited amounts may be sold, or the customer may require the permission of a pharmacist to purchase them
- 9. A term used to describe a medication that is usually given by injection into a vein, the skin, or muscle that bypasses the gastrointestinal system

- 10. The study of the absorption, metabolism, distribution, and elimination of drugs

- 1. The movement of a medication throughout the blood, organs, and tissues after administration
- 2. Medications that can be purchased without a prescription
- 3. To place into; commonly used for ophthalmic or otic drugs
