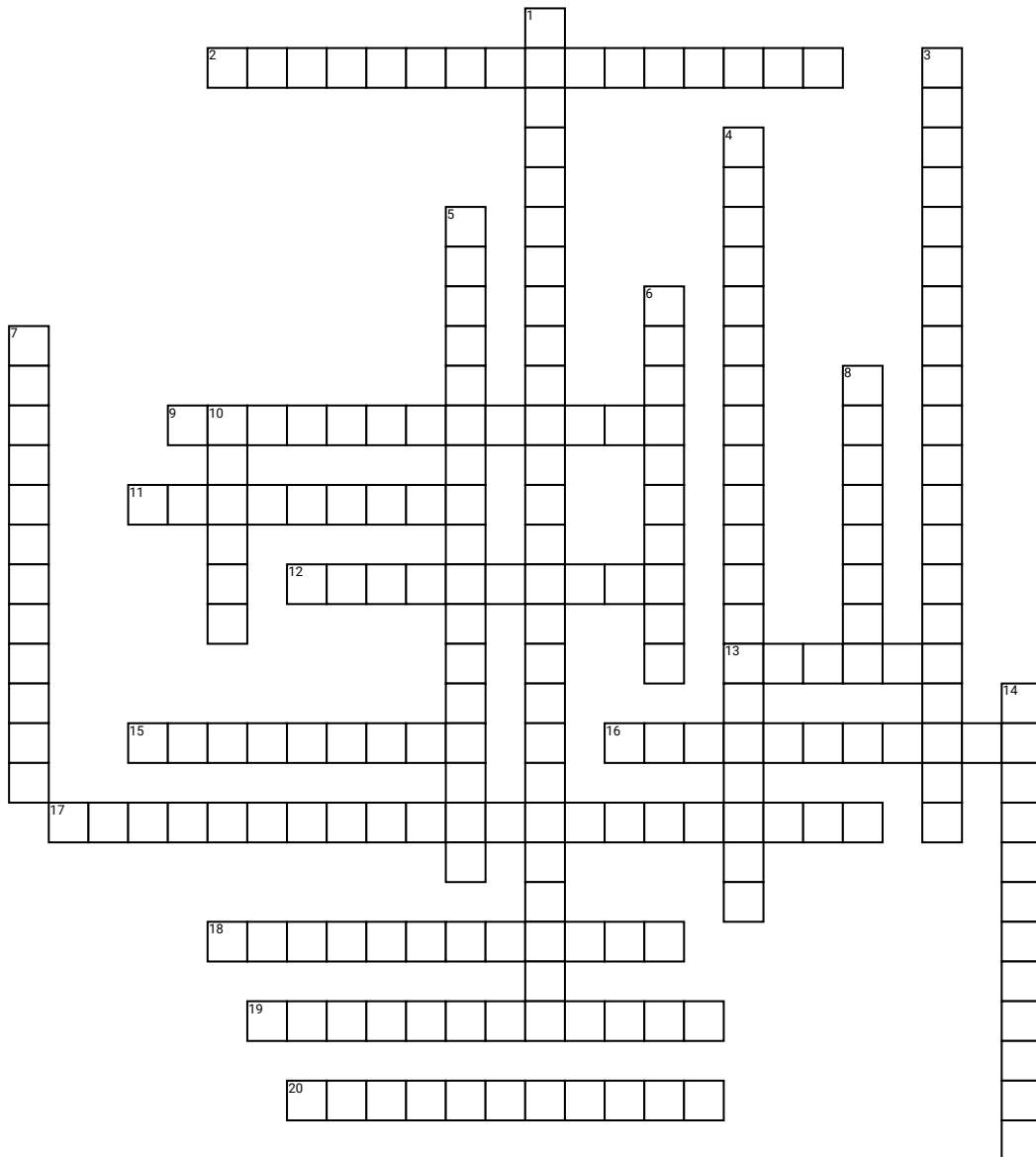


# Chapter 6 The Spirit of Reform
