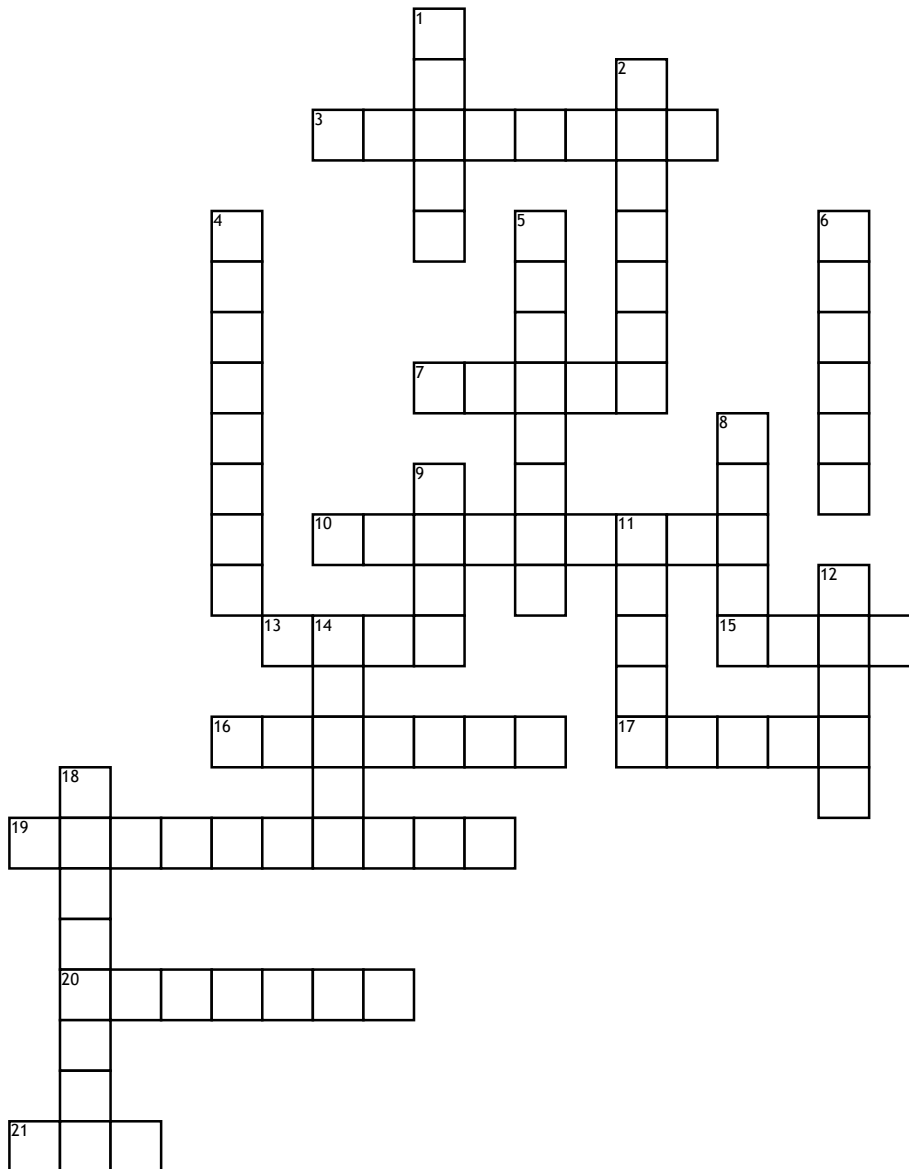

- 17. above true or normal pitch
- 19. two different notes that sound the same
- 20. the rhythm of a piece of poetry or a piece of music

- 21. a group of notes based on a particular note and comprising a scale, regarded as forming the tonal basis of a piece or passage of music

- 1. the quality of a sound governed by the rate of vibrations producing it; the degree of highness or lowness of a tone
- 2. a short ceremonial tune or flourish played on brass instruments
- 4. an accented beat, usually the first of the bar
- 5. the varying levels of volume
- 6. a series of eight notes occupying the interval between two notes, one having twice or half the frequency of vibration of the other

- 8. a group of notes sounded together, as a basis of harmony
- 9. the main accent or rhythmic unit in music or poetry
- 11. a single tone of definite pitch made by a musical instrument or the human voice
- 12. the speed at which a passage of music is or should be played
- 14. in a slow tempo and dignified in style
- 18. a scene or passage written for performance by a whole cast, choir, or group of instruments
