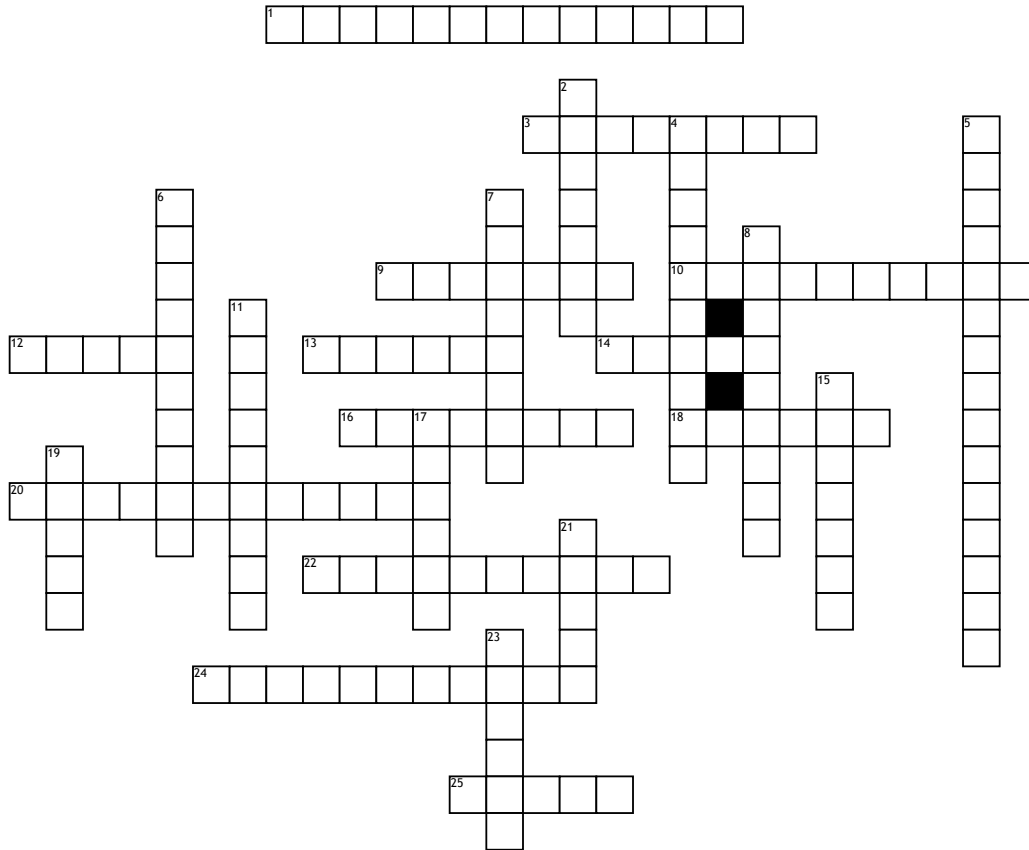


Choir Crossword

3. The symbol at the beginning of the staff for lower voices or instruments.
9. Two or more parts sounding simultaneously.
10. The symbol that appears at the beginning of the staff.

13. A direction in sheet music indicating the tempo is to be very fast.
14. 3 or 4 notes played simultaneously in harmony.

16. A style of male singing where by partial use of the vocal chords, the voice is able to reach the pitch of a female.

18. A group singing in unison.
20. Reading and singing of music at first sight.
22. Is played very loudly represented by "ff"
24. To gradually become softer.

2. Line that separates measures.
4. Heavier sound made when you sing lower pitches that resonate primarily in the chest region.
5. This is essential to sing in tune with strength and tone.

8. A lighter sound made when you sing higher pitches which resonate more in the head and face region.
