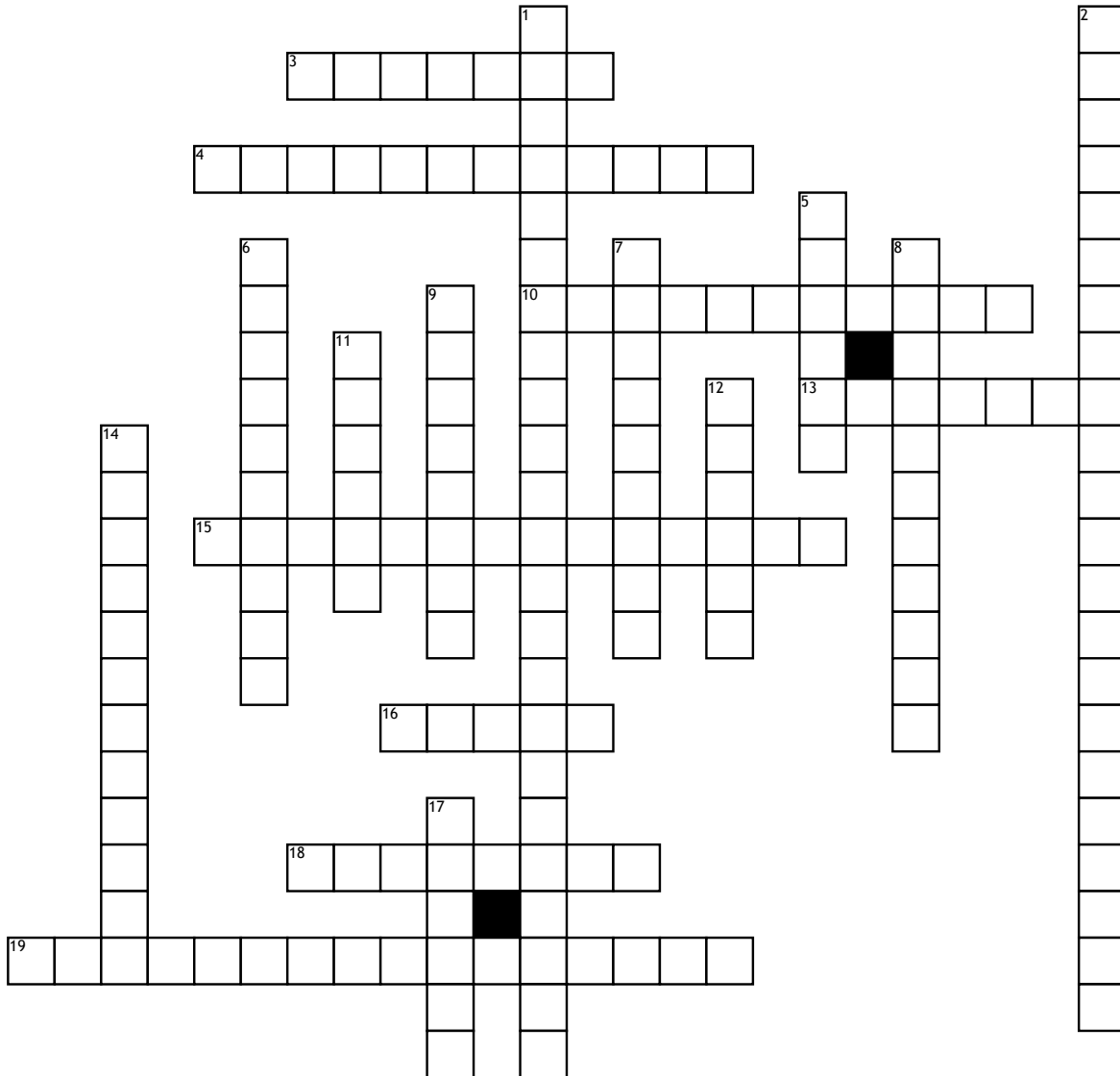


# Citizenship Vocabulary
