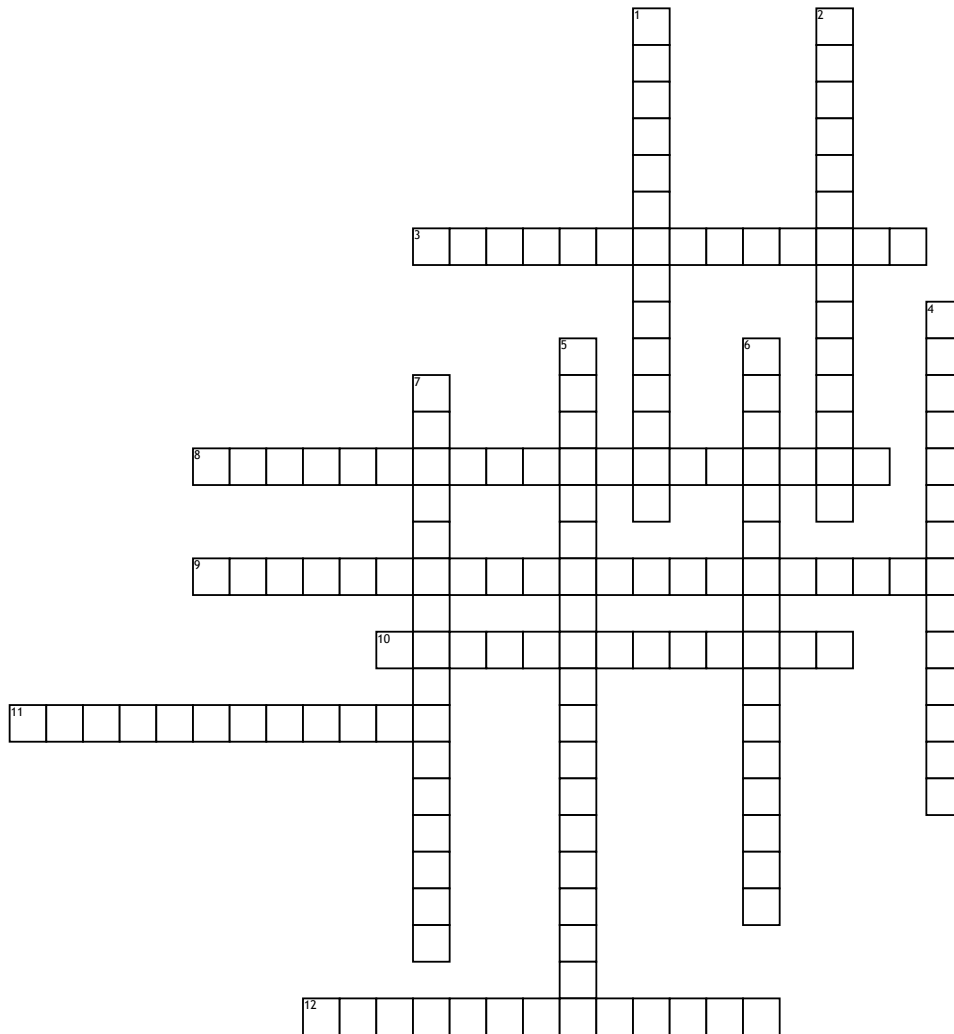

9. legal concept under which the Supreme Court has nationalized the Bill of Rights by making most of its provisions applicable to the states through the 14th amendment

10. written authorization from a court specifying the area to be searched and what the police are searching for

11. first 10 amendments to the U.S. constitution

12. situation in which the police have reasonable grounds to believe that a person should be arrested

1. constitutional and other legal protections against government actions

2. government actions preventing material from being published

4. establishes the four great liberties: freedom of the press, of speech, of religion, and of assembly

5. part of the 1st amendment stating that "congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion"

6. communication is the form of advertising, which can be restricted more than many other types of speech

7. says that people cannot be deprived of life, liberty, or property by the U.S. or state governments without due process of law
