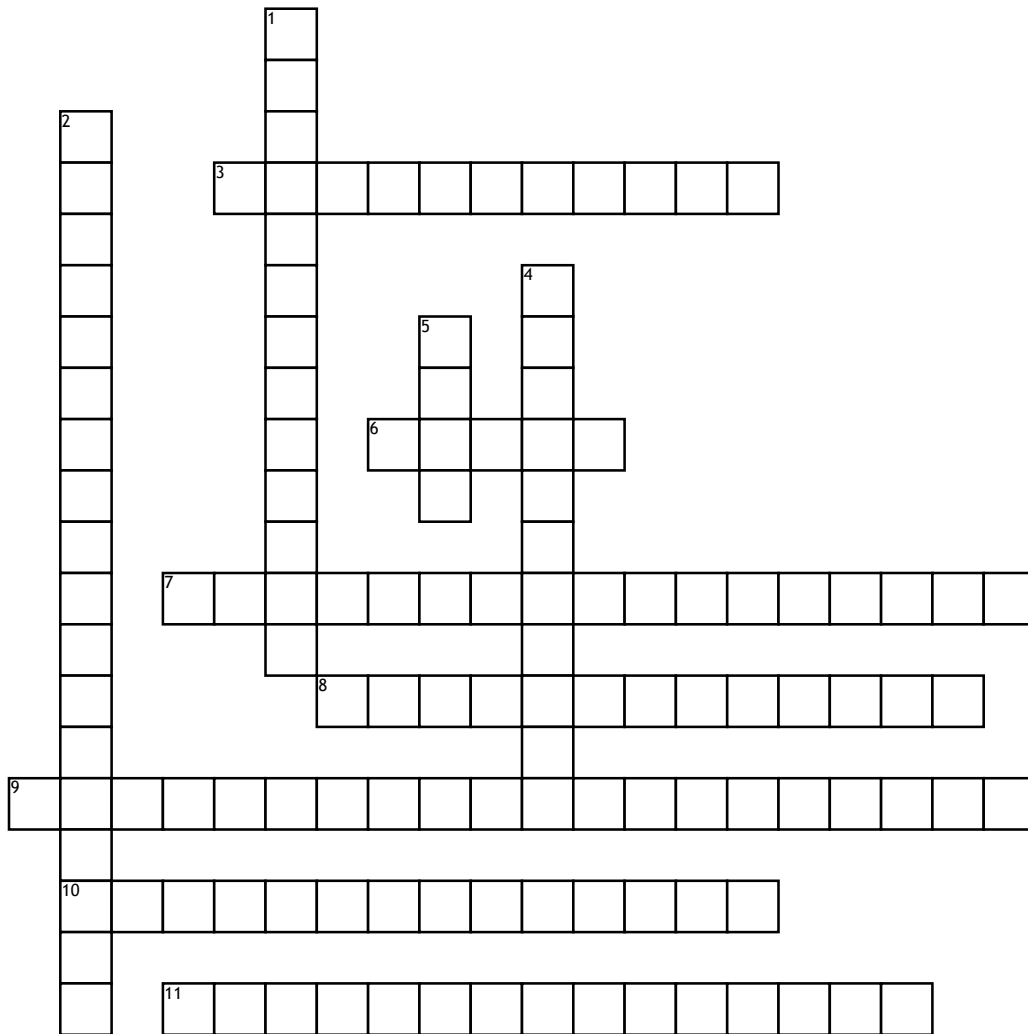

- 8. This Amendment granted citizenship and equal civil and legal rights to African Americans and slaves who had been emancipated after the American Civil War
- 9. The Act made racial, religious, and sex discrimination by employers illegal and gave the government the power to enforce all laws governing civil rights
- 10. Four Students from North Carolina A&T sat at an all-white counter at Woolworth and refused to move until served

### Down

- 1. Political Protest against segregation by Blacks and Whites riding buses together through the south in 1961
- 2. Civil Rights Leader, He opposed discrimination against blacks by organizing nonviolent resistance and peaceful demonstrations
- 4. State and local laws passed from the end of Reconstruction in 1877 through the mid-1950s by which white southerners reasserted their dominance by denying African Americans basic social, economic, and civil rights.
- 5. Thousands of children gathered together to march downtown to talk to the mayor about segregation.
