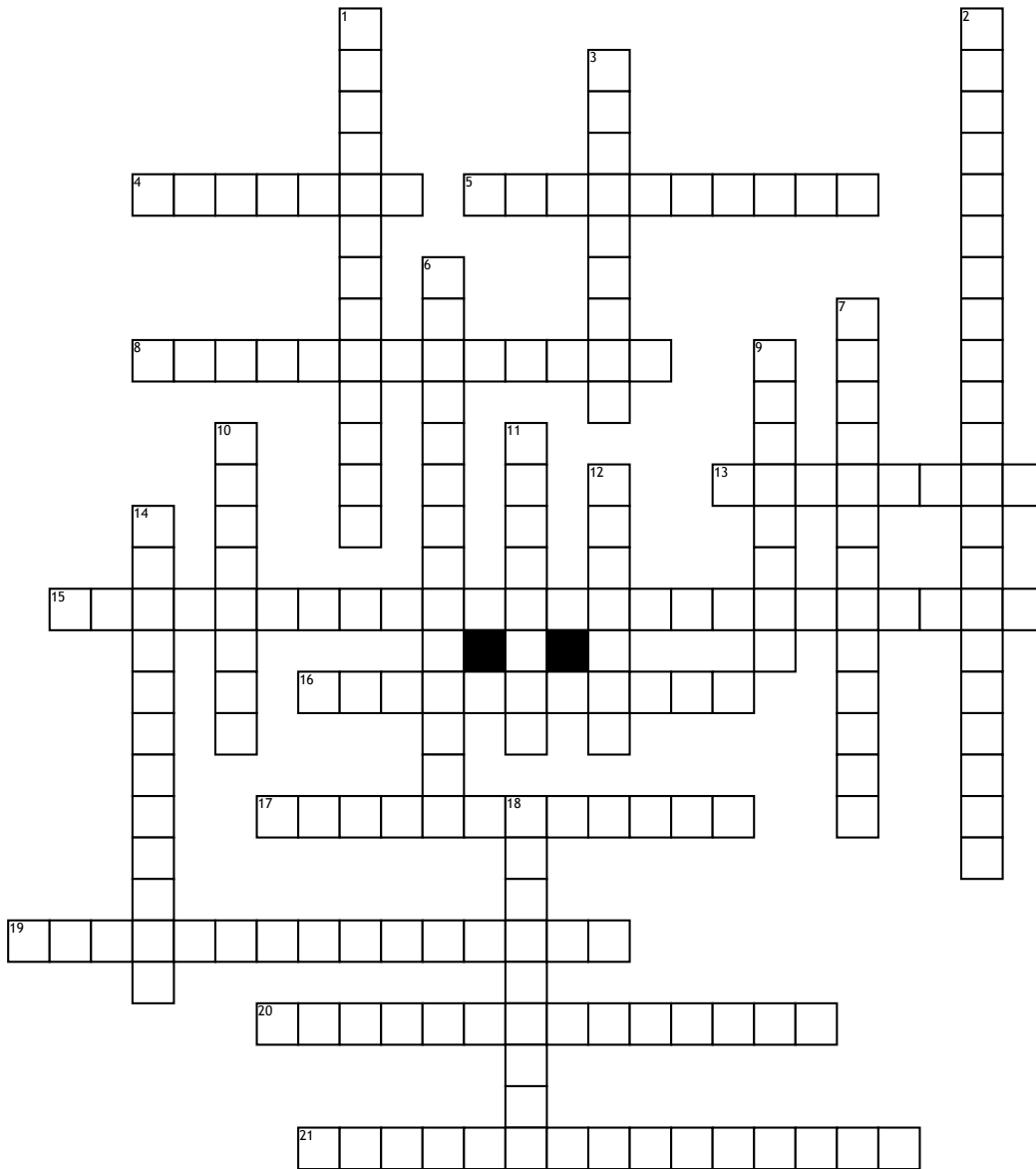

3. the legal prohibition and ending of slavery, especially of slavery of blacks in the U.S
