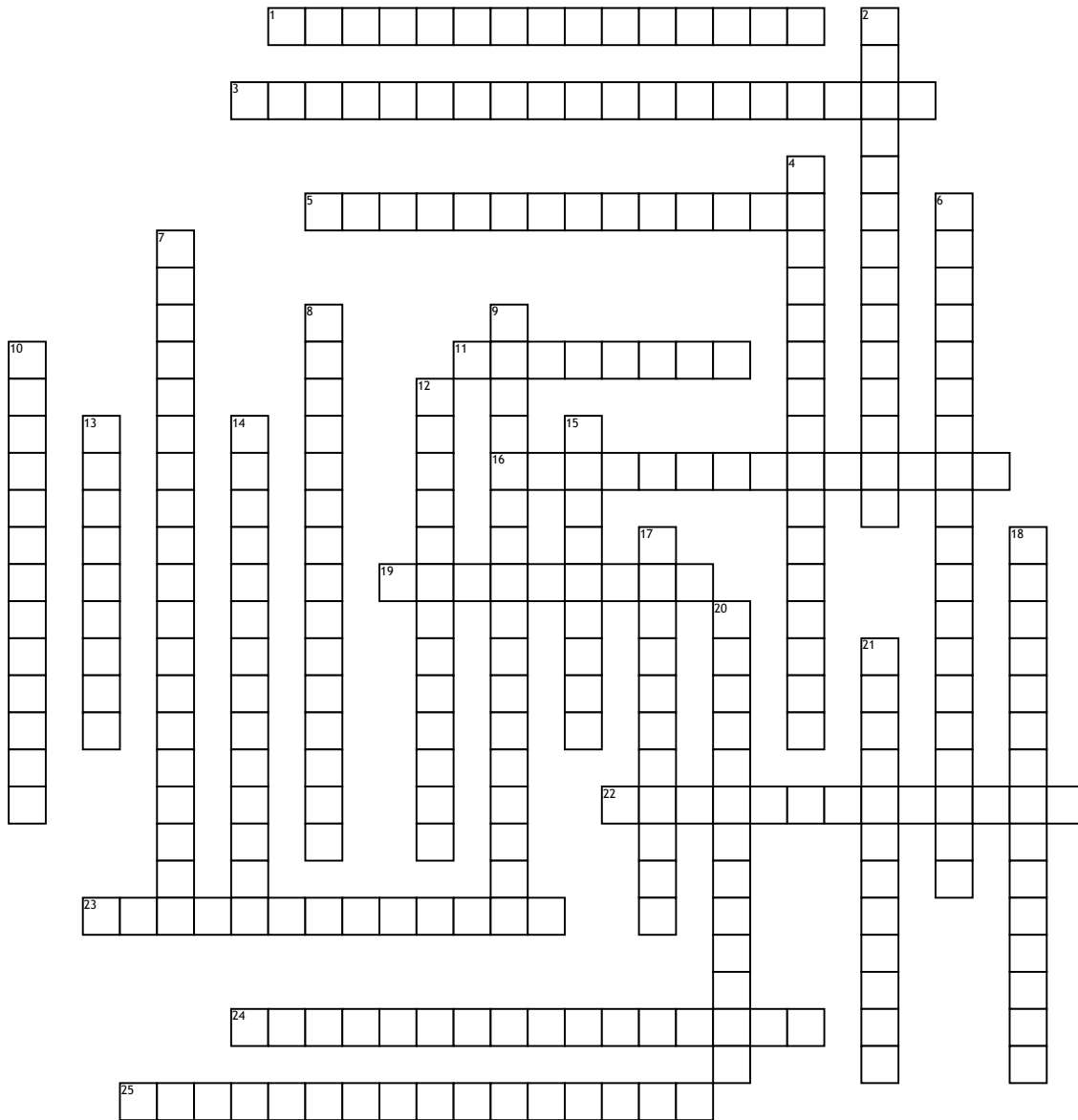

1. Anti-slavery political party formed in 1854 in protest against the Kansas-Nebraska Act
3. Network of abolitionists who secretly helped slaves escape to freedom
5. 1852 anti-slavery novel
11. the belief that native-born white Americans are superior to foreign-born immigrants
16. Sixteenth POTUS
19. Formal withdrawal of a state from the Union
22. Fifteenth POTUS
23. Political party formed in 1848 to oppose the extension of slavery into U.S. territories
24. 1850 law meant to help slaveholders recapture runaway slaves
25. Agreement designed to ease tensions between free states and slave states; California entered as a free state while the South got a Fugitive Slave Act

2. Fourteenth POTUS
4. Anti-Catholic and anti-immigrant party formed in the 1850's; aka Order of the Star-Spangled Banner or American Party
6. Laws passed by Northern states forbidding the imprisonment of escaped slaves
7. Author of Uncle Tom's Cabin
8. Thirteenth POTUS
9. 1854 law that would allow voters in Kansas and Nebraska to choose whether or not to allow slavery
10. 1846 proposed law to outlaw slavery in any territory gained from the War with Mexico
12. Abolitionist newspaper editor who helped found the Republican Party
13. Abolitionist who used violence to accomplish his goals; led the Pottawatomie Massacre, Kansas and Harper's Ferry Raid, Virginia

14. Term used to describe the 1854-1856 violence between pro-slavery and anti-slavery supporters in Kansas
15. Slave who sued for his freedom in the Supreme Court in 1857; led to the Missouri Compromise being declared unconstitutional
17. Chief Justice of the Supreme Court who wrote the lead opinion in the Dred Scott case
18. "The Little Giant"; U.S. senator from Illinois who worked to pass the Compromise of 1850; proposed the Kansas-Nebraska Act in 1854; defeated Abraham Lincoln in his 1858 re-election campaign
20. "The Black Moses", a conductor on the Underground Railroad who led enslaved people to freedom
21. Mexican-American War hero and Republican Party candidate in the 1856 presidential election
