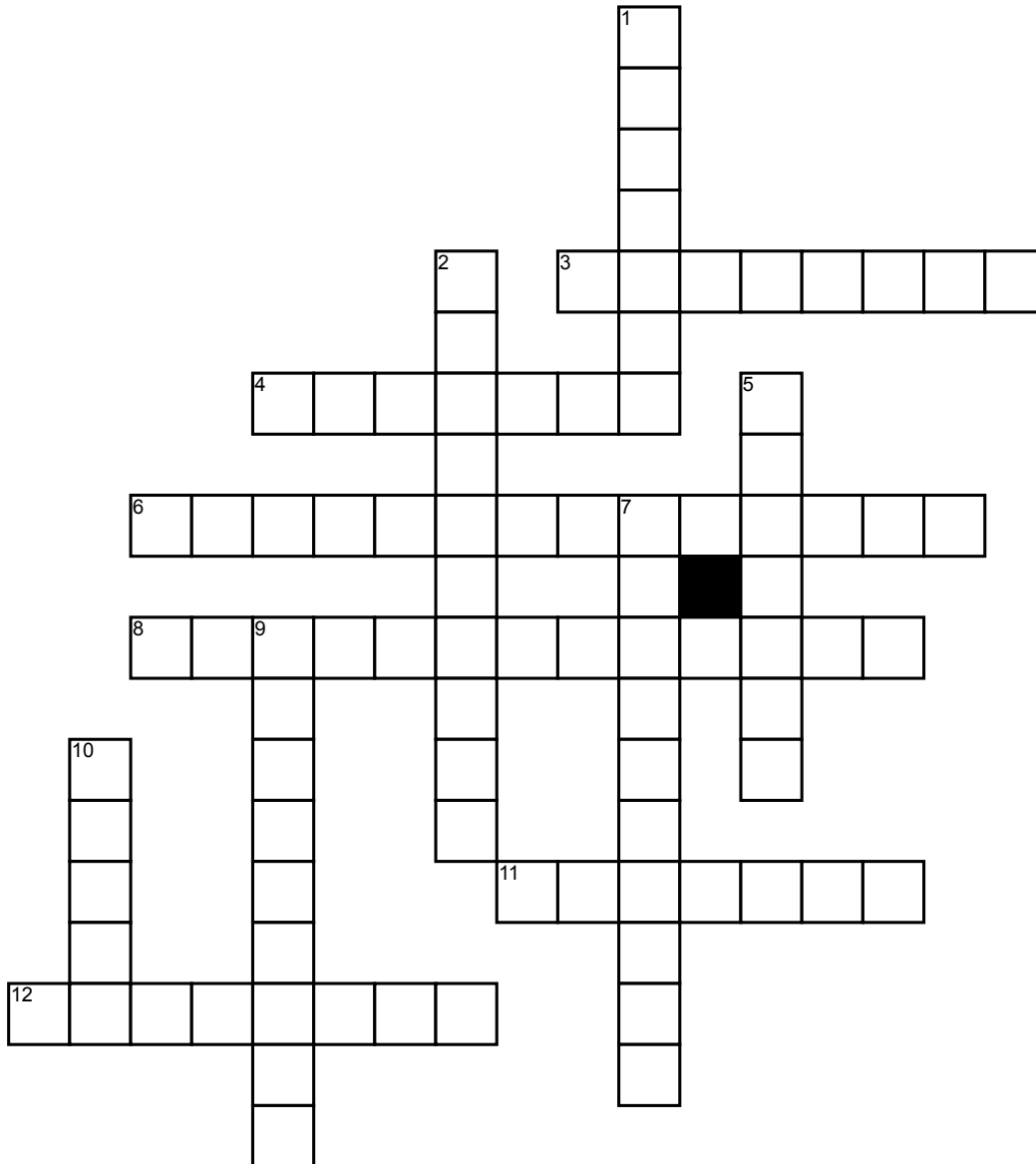

3. These are very long fibres e.g. silk

4. Dense cloth formed by compressed woolen fibres

6. This finish is applied to fabric to resist wetting, but will allow water and air to pass through.

8. Cotton is sometimes treated with caustic soda to make it more lustrous.

11. When moisture travels along the surface of a fibre but is not absorbed

12. Is the finished end that is parallel to the warp thread

1. A pile on the surface of the fabric e.g. Corduroy

2. This finish is applied to prevent water or air passing through the fabric.

5. Little balls of fluff formed on the surface of certain fabrics e.g. nylon

7. The ability of a fibre to stretch and then return to its original shape and size.

9. The ability of a fibre to spring back to its original shape and bulk after being pressed.

10. _____ is a single - hair like thread used in the manufacture of yarn.
