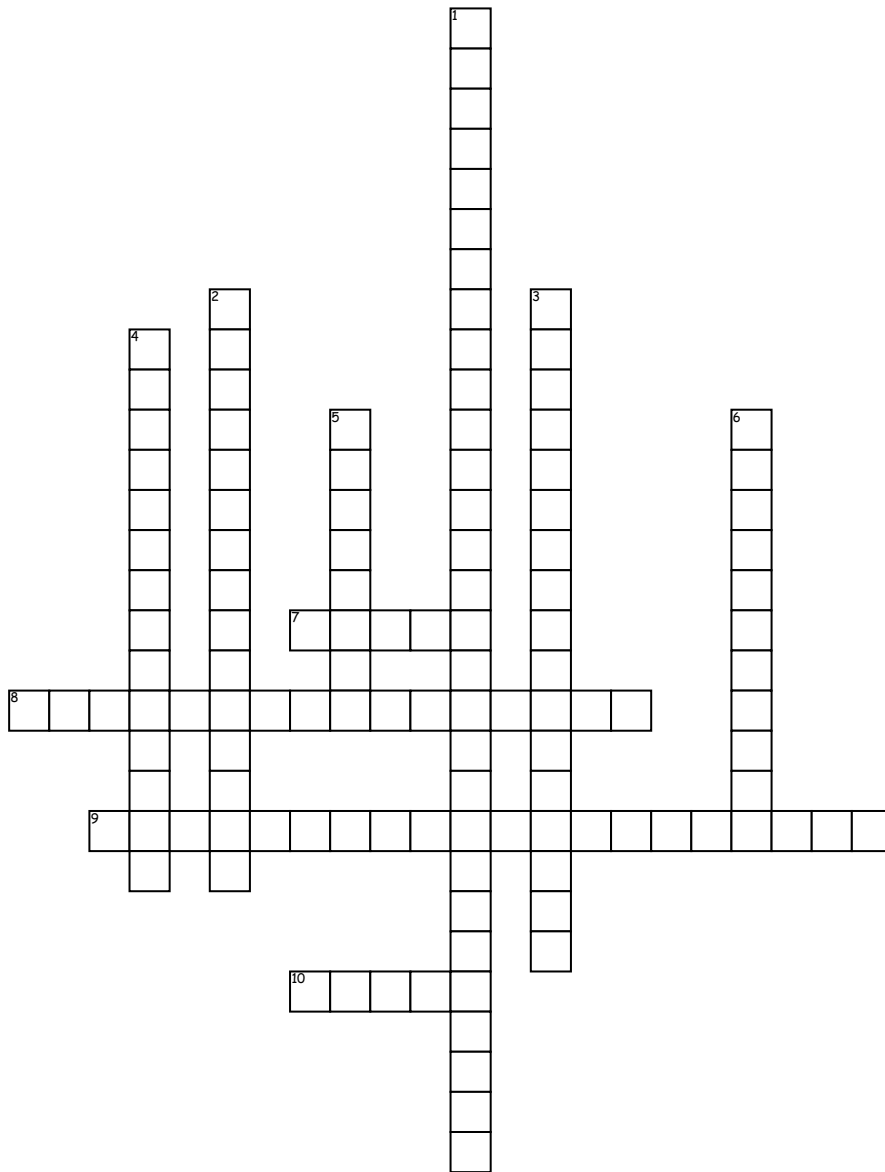

1. Colleges and universities that do not consider an applicant's financial needs when deciding admittance use one of these policies. Other schools that use this second policy consider financial aid needs as part of the admissions process.

2. this is a college applicant whose parent(s)/legal guardian(s) did not complete a college Bachelor's Degree

3. Some colleges and universities offer a wide time frame rather than a specific deadline date for students to submit their application and receive acceptance status

4. Universities that offer advanced degrees award these upon completion

5. Scholarships, grants, and discounts that colleges can award to admitted students without regard to financial need

6. Some colleges and universities require students to submit their final transcripts and discipline records at the end of their senior year in high school
