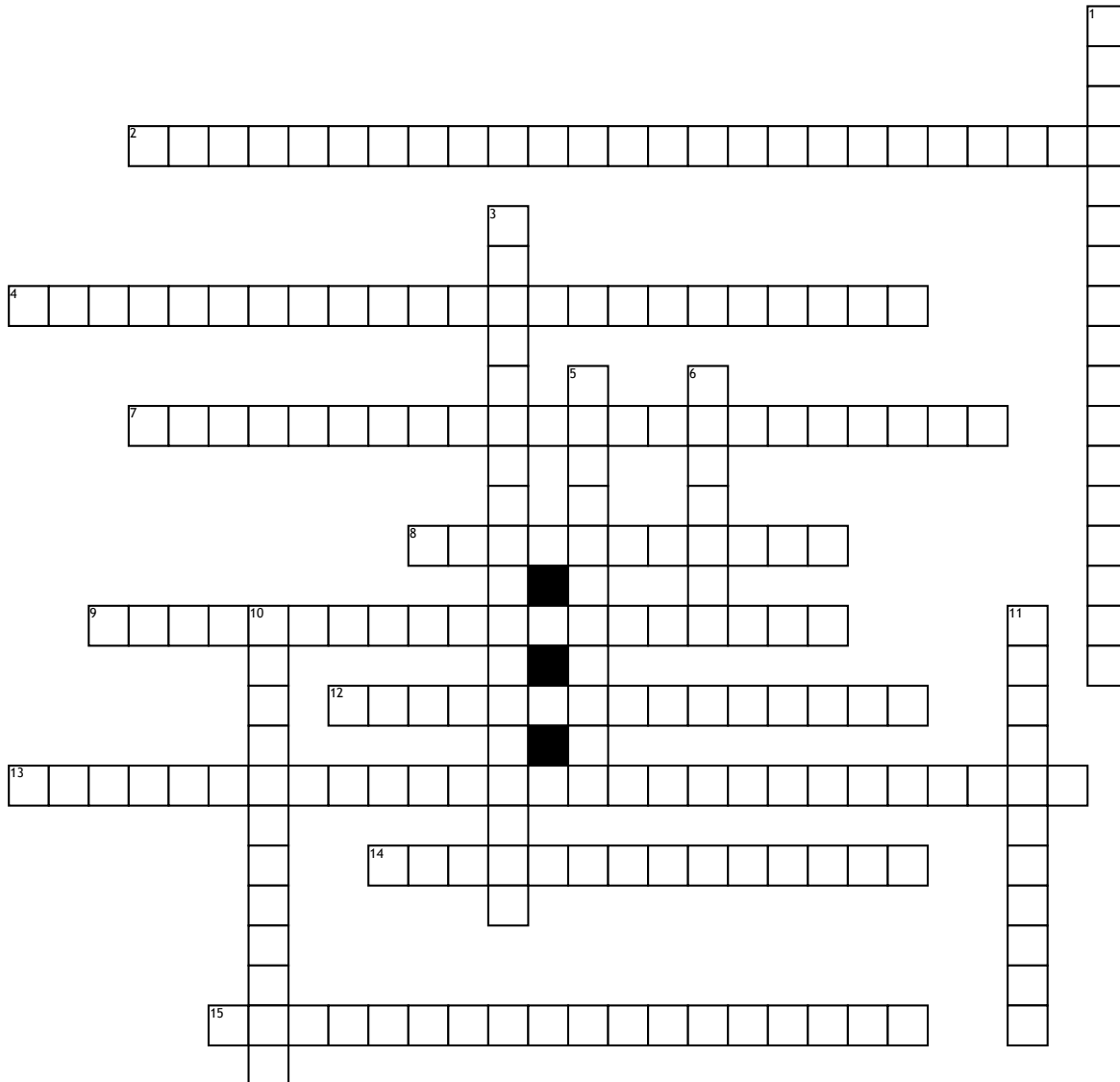

2. A degree (60-61 credit hours) that prepares students to transfer to a university and major in fields such as biology, chemistry, geology, mathematics, or physics

4. Allows community colleges to admit any student who has earned a high school diploma or its equivalent

7. A degree (60-61 credit hours) that prepares students to transfer to a university and major in engineering

8. Number of hours associated with a particular class. These hours are used to calculate your GPA and determine your tuition bill each semester

9. A degree (64 credit hours) with an emphasis on courses such as art, drama, or music

12. A degree (60-61 credit hours) that prepares students to transfer to a university and major in fields such as English, fine arts, foreign languages, history, philosophy, psychology, or sociology

13. A degree (64 credit hours) designed for individuals wishing to broaden their education, with emphasis on personal interest, growth, and development

14. Commonly used to assess a students' writing, reading, and math skills; scores indicate what classes a student can begin taking

15. A course you must successfully complete before enrolling in a higher level course
