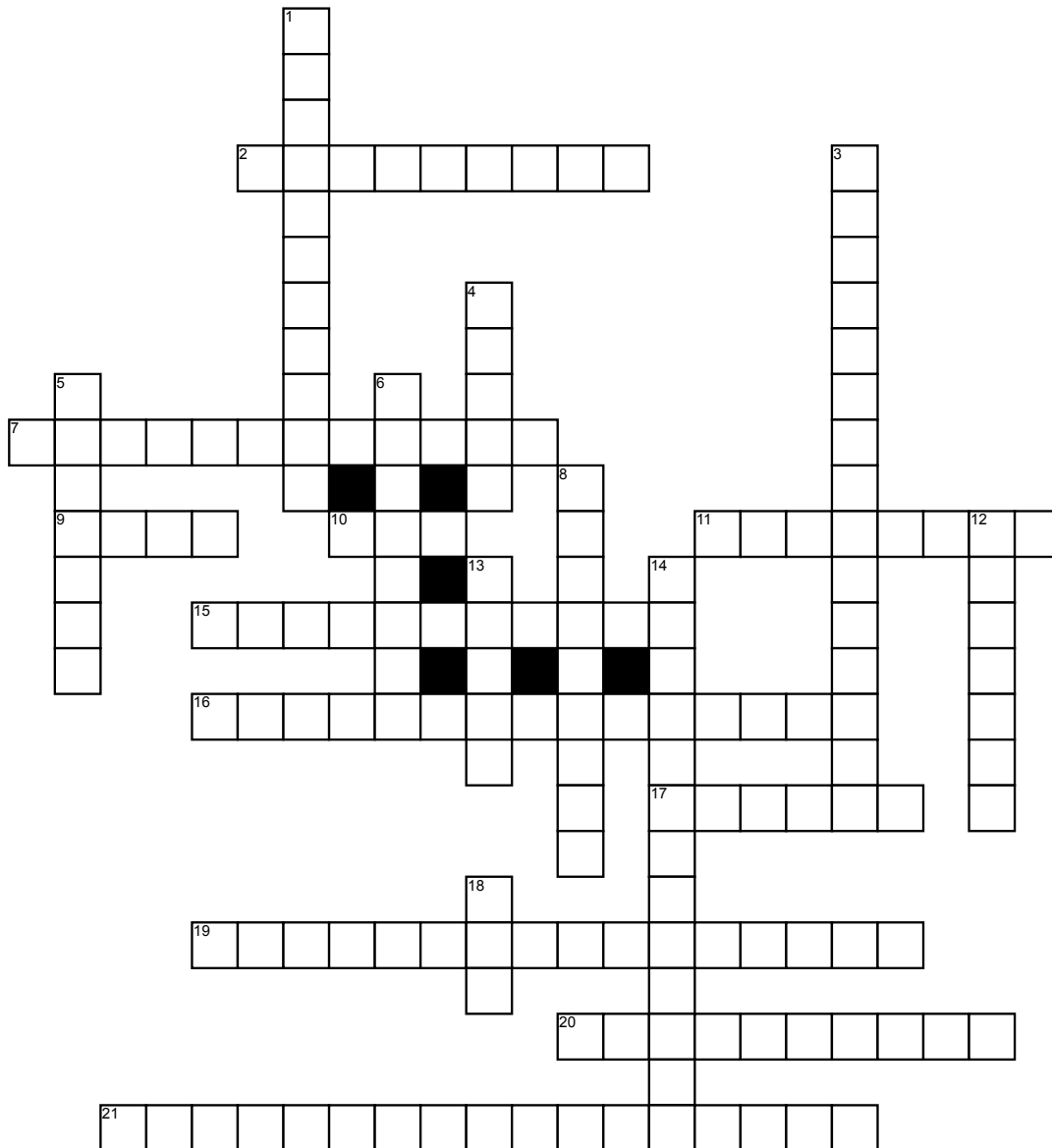


# College terms

- 2.** Money earned in a job obtained through the help of the college's financial aid office.
- 7.** Money given or loaned to you to help pay for college.
- 9.** A form of financial aid that you must repay.
- 10.** A standardized college admission test. It features four main sections: English, math, reading and science — and an optional essay section.
- 11.** First-year college student.
- 15.** A formal request for admission to a college or university; requires the submission of forms and other materials.
- 16.** A four-year degree in a specified subject.
- 17.** Awards based on financial need that do not require repayment.

- 19.** A two-year degree that generally prepares a student for further study.

**20.** The official record of your course work at a school or college. Your high school transcript is usually required for college admission and for some financial aid packages.

**21.** A number that shows overall academic performance. It's computed by assigning a point value to each grade you earn.

- 1.** Financial aid based on merit and paid directly to the student in the form of an outright gift.
- 3.** A student who enrolls in a college after having attended another college.
- 4.** To attend a class without receiving academic credit.

**5.** Certificate issued by a school, college, or university to a student who has met coursework and graduation requirements.

**6.** A class you can take that is not specifically required by your major or minor.

**8.** The decision to allow a student to enter a college or university.

**12.** School official, usually assigned by your college or university, who can help choose your classes and make sure you are taking the right courses to graduate.

**13.** The subject of study in which the student chooses to specialize.

**14.** A college student who is working toward an associate or a bachelor's degree.

**18.** The College Board's standardized college admission test. It features three main sections: math, reading and writing, which includes a written essay.
