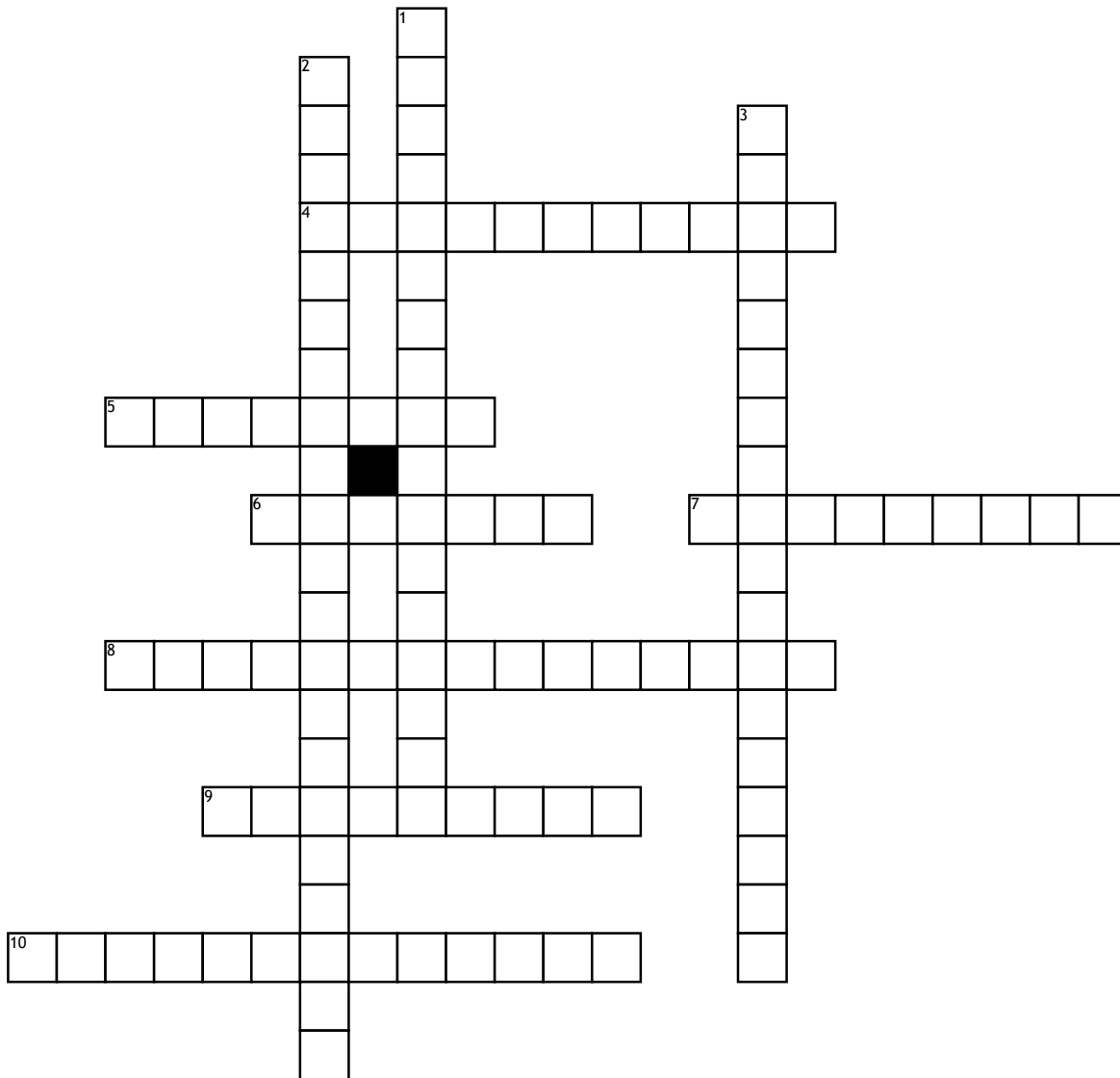

4. Refers to colleges/ universities with a focus and core curriculum that includes classes in the arts, humanities, social sciences, and sciences

5. Scholarships, grants, and discounts that colleges can award to admitted students without regard to financial need

6. Is the grade point average of core classes not electives

7. Student can get jobs on campus and the U.S. federal government helps pay their salary

8. Also referred to as an Undergraduate Degree

9. A measure of how a student's GPA compares to other students in the same graduating class

10. Is similar to early action, but if the student is accepted to the colleges, it is a binding agreement and the student must attend that school

1. Unlike subsidized loans, the government does not supplement interest accrued during college

2. Income-eligible students may be able to waive or reduce college application fees and related ACT/SAT fees.
