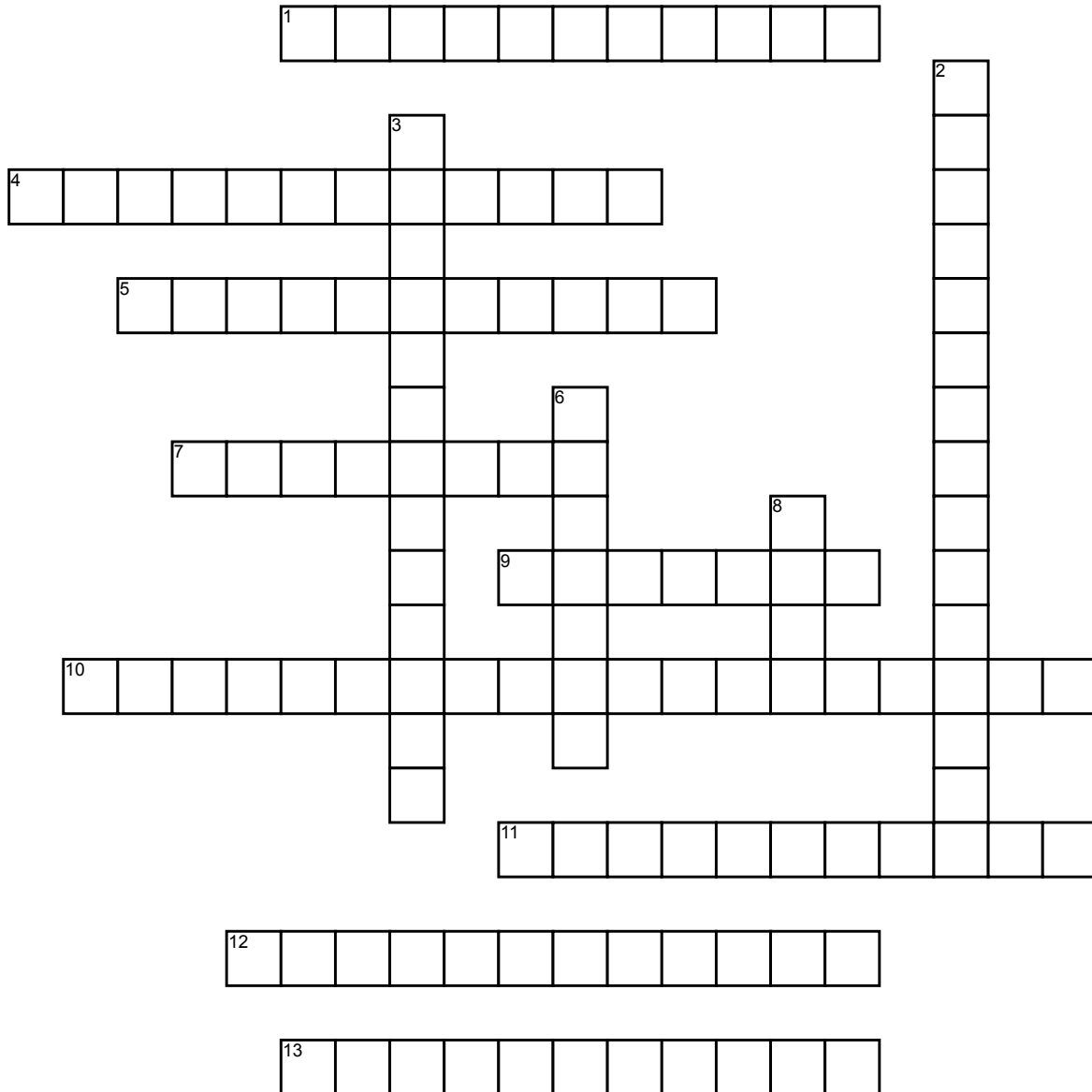

- 5. a seventeenth-century Creek leader and the head chief of a Yamacraw town on the site of present-day Savannah, Georgia. He gave his land to James Oglethorpe to build the city of Savannah.
- 7. a coastal Georgia city, is separated from South Carolina by the Savannah River.
- 9. an individual person or member of a board given control or powers of administration of property in trust with a legal obligation to administer it solely for the purposes specified.

- 10. was King of Great Britain and Ireland, Duke of Brunswick-Lüneburg and Prince-elector of the Holy Roman Empire from 11 June 1727 until his death.
- 11. a group of German-speaking Protestant colonists, founded the town of Ebenezer in what is now Effingham County.
- 12. was of mixed Yamacraw and English ancestry. She facilitated in the development of Colonial Georgia and became an important intermediary between Muscogee Creek Indians and the English colonists.
- 13. a colony ruled or administered by officials appointed by and responsible to the reigning sovereign of the parent state.
