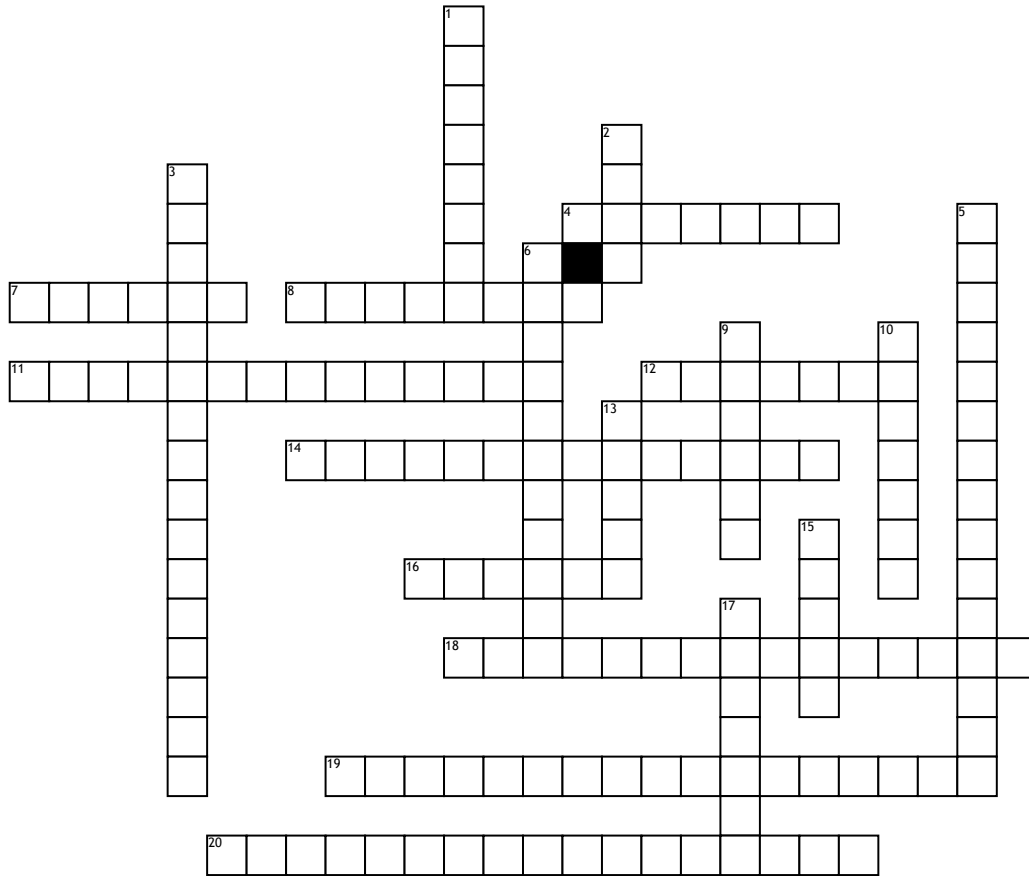


# Comic Books Terminology
