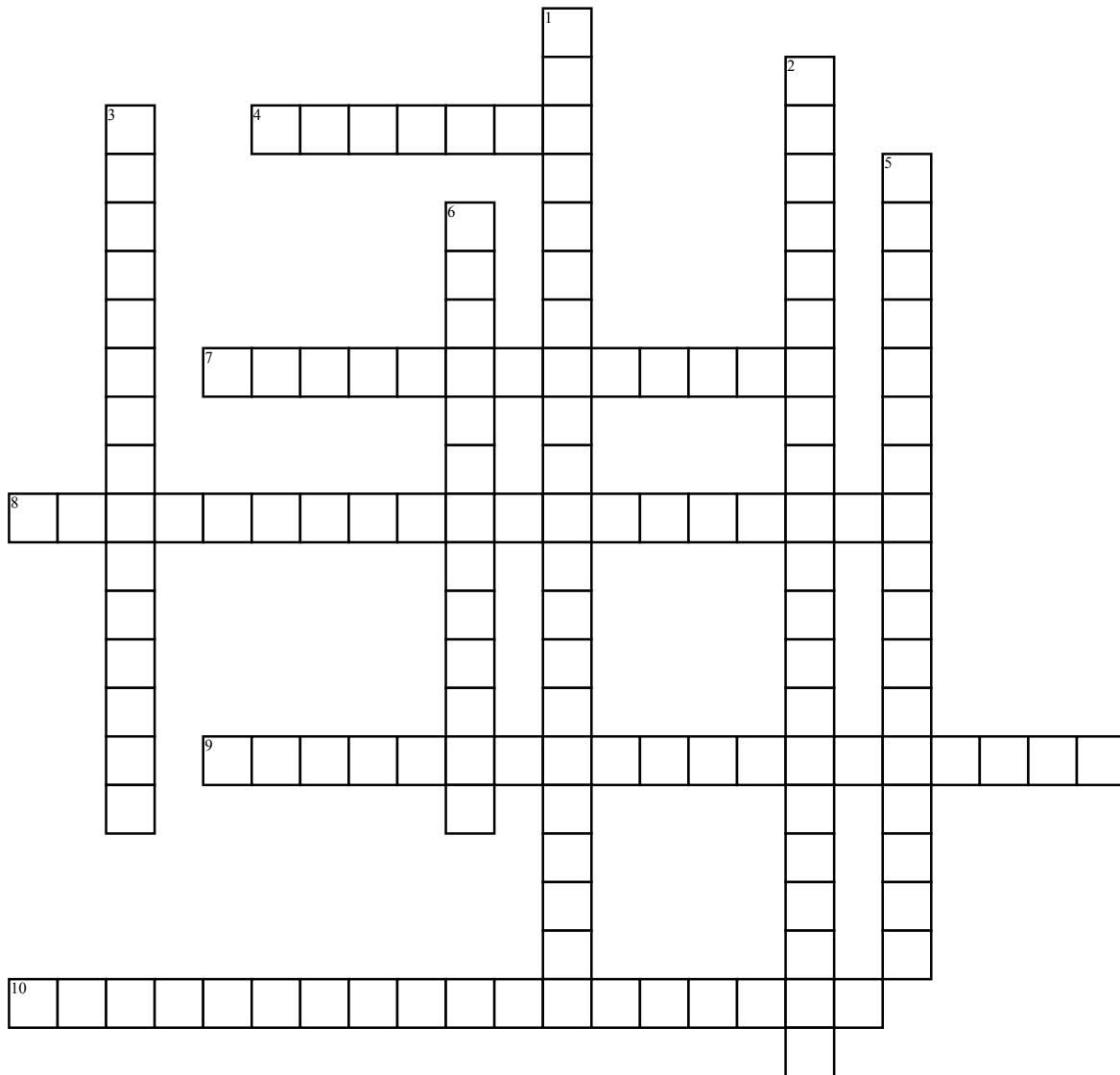

## Across

4. technique in which the desired behavior is “molded” by first rewarding any act similar to that behavior and then requiring ever-closer approximations to the desired behavior before giving the reward
7. learned reactions that follow one another in sequence, each reaction producing the signal for the next
8. stimulus such as money that becomes rewarding through its link with a primary reinforcer
9. learning in which a certain action is reinforced or punished, resulting in corresponding increases or decreases in occurrence
10. training of an organism to remove or terminate an unpleasant stimulus

1. increasing the strength of a given response by removing or preventing a painful stimulus when the response occurs
2. training of an organism to respond so as to prevent the occurrence of unpleasant stimulus
3. process of influencing behavior by means of unpleasant stimuli
5. stimulus that satisfies a biological need such as food or water
6. stimulus or event that follows a response and increases the likelihood that the response will be repeated
